# 'Compromise' transit plan OK to Oakland executive

A compromise pian on southeast Michigan transportation plans might be an acceptable to Oakind County Executive Daniel T. Murphy. The compromise pian is the work of Wayne County Board Chairman Rosel. Bobb. It's designed to reorganize the board of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) to give counties a voice and finance the 1990 pian of public transportation.

portation.
"It's a take-off on what I sugges-ted," said Murphy of the Bobo plan.
"I don't see anything horrendous about if."

BOBO PROPOSED SEMTA have a nine-member board with three appointments made by the governor and six from county and local governments. "The six appointers from county and local governments should be appointed by chairmen of the boards of commissioners of the counties of Macomb. Oakland and Wayne," said Bobo. "The formula would delegate one ap-

ties of maximo.

Wayne, said Bob.

"The formula would delegate one appointee per \$00,000 to one million in population, and one additional appointee per each additional \$00,000 in population." Wayne Courty would get four appointees—two by the mayor of

MURPHY SAID he was 'not too much for or against' the Bobo plan, athough it might be acceptable. "One difference is that his formula calls for a board seat for every 500,000 population." said Murphy, "white mine was one seat for every 300,000.

"I'm against his financing plan."
Murphy added. Bobo calls for a three-county motor vehicle tax, although more heavily weighted toward com-mercial vehicles than one proposed by Gov. William Milliken.

Murphy is pushing a joint Oakland-Macomb plan to levy the vehicle tax on all 88 Michigan counties instead of only the three in the metropolitan De-troit area as Bobo and Milkien ask Murphy's plan also calls for an ave-age 17.30 per vehicle instead of the 110 proposed by the governor, and Murphy's plan sould give half the rev-enue to county roap-commissions
