He also buys plants locally rather than having them shapped up directly from Florida, as he said many plant outlets do Plants that are sprayed for insects and are given time for acclimation are more likely to sarvive.

"It's an extra expense, but the plants are stable," he explained.

Durrwachter, whose shop measures 1.500 square feet, said he is frequently called on for advice or treating sick plants often purchased at shops not specializing in plants.
