Both libraries were locally financed through a millage which was approved in 1987 for the expansion program. The lower level of the new library accommodates community rooms, a children's room and history room for the historical society.

The main level contains adult fiction and non-fiction as well as study areas.

The building was designed by the architectural firm of Merritt, Cole and McCallum. a Farmington firm. Lacet applied was done by Mrs. Betty Frankel, of Farmington Hills.
