In nonleague game

Raiders rip BH Andover

North Farmington's Mark Thompson took the opening tip off and went in for a lay-up giving the Raiders a lead they never lost as they defeated Bloomfield Hills Andover, 67-57, on Tuesday.

Thompson led the Raiders' fast break and teammate Mike Morrow controlled the boards at both ends of the court in the critical first period. Morrow and Thompson combined for 41 of North Farmington's first 15 first-quarter points to give the Raiders a 15-8 lead.

North Farmington enlarged its lead to 34-21 at the half by taking advantage of Andover turnovers. But the Raiders were sloppy themselves in the second-quarter by committing numerous fouls which allowed the Andover Barons to score nine of their 13 points in that period on free throws.

The rest of the game was a see-saw battle with neither team taking a decisive edge. The fast breaking and fouls continued, but Andover began moving the ball inside against the Raider zone defense in the fourth period to close North Farmington's lead to the winning margin of 67-57.

THOMPSON AND MORROW led all scorers with 17 and 15, respectively. Leading the Baron attack was Bob DiNapoli with 12 points and Greg David with 11.

Andover coach Hal Henderson thought the key to the game was rebounding and his team's poor shooting in the first-quarter when they hit on

only four of 14 shots.

"They outrebounded us 40-27," Henderson pointed out. "We won't get any taller so we'll have to block out better underneath the boards."

Coach Ken Dean of North Farmington was pleased with his team's balanced performance. "We're moving the ball around well because of teamwork. The kids are unselfish and we, the coaches, place a lot of emphasis on assists. But we haven't got the fast break like I want it yet."

Despite the loss Henderson is optimistic. "We're going to improve as the season goes on. We've shown flashes of brilliance from time to time and we're getting better with each game. The win raised North Farmington's record to 2-1 while Andover dropped to 0-3.

North Farmington will face Livonia Franklin on Friday in their Northwest Suburban League opener at Livonia. Andover travels to Garden City East in a nonleague contest.

Hawk wrestlers take 2nd in meet

The Novi High wrestling team defended its Detroit Country Day School Invitational title last weekend with five first-place honors. Farmington Harrison was second with four firsts.

Novi scored 126 1/2 points to retain the crown in the fifth annual meet. Harrison had 117 points while the host Country Day grapplers, winners of the tourney in its first three years, had three first-place finishes for third place and 57 1/2 points. Also taking part in the meet were Hartland, 56, Lutheran North, 37, and Cranbrook, seven.

Claiming top honors for Novi were McKenney in the 105-pound class with a pin over Sutterline, of Harrison in 3:54; McCarty with a 6-4 decision over Harrison's Maher in the 128 division; Sanna in the 138 category with a 5-1 verdict over Kevin Johns, of Harrison; Maser in the 185 class, and Spiers with a pin over Harrison's Brian Steffen in the heavyweight event.

Harrison's tourney champions were Paul Thiel in the 132 event with a 3-1 decision over Novi's Stevens; Damian Crudele with a 6-2 verdict over Mills of Novi, in the 145 division; sophomore Fred Blackmer in the 155 class with a pin over Hartland's Kuzula at 4:54; and Tim Harsha in the 187 event with a pin over Knoll, of Lutheran North.

Country Day's three champions were Larry Webb in the 98 division with a pin over Hartland's West at 2:53; Steve Modell with a 5-0 decision over Novi's Spielman in the 112 event; and Paul Clark with a 6-5 verdict over

Novi's Mills in the 119 class. Country Day coach John Campbell also said he was encouraged by the performance of sophomore Mark Zobi in the 145 division where he finished third.
