Sexism in education will be examined in a course Michigan State University is offering at Kingswood School, Cranbrook beginning Jan. 24 and meeting 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. three Saturdays.

The university extension course, "Sexism in the Classroom," is designed for parents, educators and others interested in how sexual inequality is transmitted and maintained in the educational system and how it can be overcome. It is worth
