That 25 centar, Horner contends, is getting harder to find. One in 25 homeowners are running behind in mort-sage payments, many families are over their heads in debt and don't know how to get out from under, he said.

When bills start pouring in to Criticans shoppers in mid-January, business will be brisk for the Southfield-based Credit Courseling Centers Inc., predicts the company's president and general manager.

"We re in the business of servicing over-actended families resolve their debt problems." said Al Horner, a Farmington resident, "Some of consumers have decided to have a big Christmas this year to make up the start year. They he having trouble keeping their spending down."

Not as much cash is available as in prior years, cost of living is piraling, Christmas savings clabs are on the decline and department stores and banks are promoting the use of credit cards for Christmas shoppers, Horner printed out.

THERE ARE 15 credit counseling centers throughout the state, said Horner. Credit counselors help consumers work out a plan to pay off their creditors and devise a budget to world further debts.

"When someone is in a serious bind, we work out debt rehabilitation programs, contact creditors and establish a plan for over-extended ebutors to pay their bills. One of the counselor's irrst steps usually is to set for all credit cards and cut them into ribbins.

"It's preferable to call a halt to deficit spending before it gets out of hand. Credit counselors advice any to keep spending within acceptable to keep spending within acceptable. cards for Christmas shoppers. Horner pointed out. our staff have gone out on field projects and they report a great deal of shopping but not as many big ticket items are being pur-chased." Horner said. "Many custom-ers are using credit cards instead of

cash.
"It's been estimated retail sales are
up 11 per cent from last year. But not
much happened in 1974, so that iocrease isn't that significant. This is a
confusing financial year and it's difficult to determine what's happening."

PERSONAL BANKRUPTCIES, Horner claimed, are rursing 38 per cent above last year. Installment loans show the highest definquency rate in 22 years, he said Getting and staying out of debt is becoming in-creasingly difficult for millions of fam-lities the contends.
