

Prof. suggests national care

Reimbursement for "health conservation" services ought to be part of national health insurance programs, says a Michigan State University urban and metropolitan studies professor.

Patricia Barnes-McConnell, recently testifying before a U.S. House Subcommittee on Health, urged "a more realistic approach to improving the health status of the entire population in the face of escalating curative health costs."

She said community health conservation would emphasize health education and preventive measures. This might also include involvement in local environmental or occupational health issues; efforts to change unhealthy but culturally supported lifestyles; and health-related community development activities.

More older students

Michigan State University's student body includes a growing number of older students, including freshmen over age 50. From 1971 to 1972, total MSU enrollment increased by seven per cent, while enrollment of students over age 23 jumped by 19.8 per cent.

SEALED BIDS for the purchase of the above bonds will be received by the undersigned at the City Hall located at 2000 Liberty Road, Farmington, Michigan, 48024 on Monday, the 19th day of January, 1974, until 4:00 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

BOND DETAILS: Said bonds will be coupon bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 each, dated December 1, 1973, numbered in direct order of maturity from 1 upwards and will bear interest from their date payable on April 1, 1974, and semi-annually thereafter.

Said bonds will mature without option of prior redemption on the 1st day of December of each year in amounts as follows:

Amount	Years
\$2,500	1976 to 1980, inclusive.

INTEREST RATE AND BIDDING DETAILS: The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates not exceeding 8% per annum, to be fixed by the bids therefor, expressed in multiples of 1/8 or 1/2 of 1%, or both. The interest on any one bond shall be at one rate only, all bonds maturing in any one year must carry the same interest rate and each coupon period shall be represented by one interest coupon.

The difference between the highest and lowest interest rate on the bonds shall not exceed 2 percent per annum. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or at a price less than 100% of their par value will be considered.

PAYING AGENT: Both principal and interest shall be payable at a bank or trust company located in Michigan qualified to act as paying agent under State or United States law, to be designated by the original purchaser of the bonds, who may also designate a co-paying agent, which may be located outside of Michigan, qualified to act as paying agent under the law of the State in which located or of the United States, both of which shall be subject to approval of the undersigned.

PURPOSE AND SECURITY: The bonds are to be issued pursuant to the provisions of Act 173, Public Acts of Michigan, 1952, as amended, for the purpose of defraying the cost of constructing street improvements in the City of Farmington, and are issued in anticipation of Motor Vehicle Highway Fund payments from the State of Michigan to be received by the City. The bonds will pledge the full faith and credit of the City of Farmington as additional security for payment of the principal and interest thereon.

GOOD FAITH: A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$300.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Treasurer of the City, must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or registered mail.

AWARD OF BONDS: The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid produces the lowest interest costs computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified in the bid, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from February 1, 1974 to their maturity and deducting therefrom any premium.

LEGAL OPINION: Bids shall be conditioned upon the undersigned approving opinion of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, a copy of which opinion will be printed on the reverse side of each bond, and the original of which will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds at the delivery thereof.

DELIVERY OF BONDS: The City will furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered without expense to the purchaser at Detroit, Michigan or such other place as may be mutually agreed upon. The usual closing documents including a certificate that no litigation is pending affecting the issuance of the bonds will be delivered at the time of delivery of the bonds. If the bonds are not tendered for delivery by twelve o'clock noon, Eastern Standard Time, on the 45th day following the date of sale, or the first business day thereafter, if said 45th day is not a business day, the successful bidder may on that day, or any time thereafter until delivery of the bonds, withdraw his proposal by serving notice of cancellation, in writing, on the undersigned in which event the City shall promptly return the good faith deposit. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of the bonds shall be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

Farmington High compiled 70 team points and finished fifth in the 32-team field at the Oakland County Wrestling Tournament last weekend at Oakland University.

Another Farmington wrestler, Earl Hall, took third in the 132-pound class. Rowland Hayward of Clarkson defeated Hall, 2-0. In the consolation finals, Hall defeated Stu Baylock, 5-0. Farmington Harrison's Damian Crudele finished fourth in the 145-pound class. He lost in the semifinals to Walled Lake Central's Gordon Baker, the eventual weight class winner. In the consolation matches, Crudele defeated Lahser's Don Rump, 10-7, and dropped a 3-1 decision to Birmingham Seaborn's Scott Reyes.

Hazel Park, always a contender for the state Class A wrestling title, won four individual championships. Detroit Catholic Central had two individual champs.

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
