

Community education offers variety program

Registration is now taking place for winter term classes sponsored by the Farmington Community Education Office. Classes begin Monday, Jan. 12.

There are 17 classes listed under the designation "special classes," some are new and others are ones that have been popular for several years.

GROUND SCHOOL FOR PRIVATE PILOT RATING covers the fundamentals of aircraft structure, aerodynamics, meteorology, pitotage and radio navigation. Study includes preparation for Private Pilot FAA written examination. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be awarded a certificate to meet FAA requirements.

CLASSES MEET MONDAYS, 7:30-10 p.m. Room 107E; fee is \$25.

INSTRUMENT GROUND SCHOOL covers fundamentals of instrument flying, aerodynamics, instruments, radio, regulations, navigation, meteorology and flight procedures. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be awarded a certificate to meet FAA requirements. Class time and cost are Mondays, 7:30-10 p.m. Room 107E; fee is \$25.

POWDER PUFF MECHANICS is for women who would like to have a basic understanding of auto maintenance and troubleshooting. Class meets Thursdays, 7-9 p.m. Room 107G; cost is \$15.

AUTO TUNE-UP AND REPAIR uses electronic diagnostic equipment to tune, minor tune-up and repairs. It is offered Tuesdays, 7-10 p.m. Room 107G; fee is \$25.

WELDING offers basic experience in gas and arc welding techniques. Gas welding includes fusion-welding, fillet weld and brazing. Arc welding includes coding of electrodes, joint preparation and testing. Class time and fee are: Tuesdays, 7-10 p.m. Room 106C; \$20 with materials extra.

PHOTOGRAPHY I is a course in general aspects of photography including technical mechanics in picture taking, use of proper lighting, meters, basic composition and film. Some use of dark room facilities is included. The course is offered Tuesdays, 7:30-9:30 p.m. Room 102E; fee is \$12.

PHOTOGRAPHY II is an advanced course permitting the student to pursue development of personal interests and techniques necessary to produce fine photographs. It meets Wednesdays, 7:30-9:30 p.m. Room 102E. Fee is \$12.

GUITAR is a course for those interested in learning to tune, play chords and simple melodies on the folk guitar. Students will need a guitar, lesson notebook and pencil. Beginning students meet 7:30-9:30 p.m. and intermediates meet 8:45-9:45 p.m. Tuesdays, Room 105C. Cost is \$42.

SPEED READING AND COMPREHENSION SKILLS is designed to help an individual improve his reading rate, concentration, vocabulary and critical comprehension. It includes (phonics), practice with visual aids and reading selections with comprehension checks. Class time and cost are: Wednesdays, 7-9 p.m. Room 222B, \$25.

WOODWORKING I is a beginning course that is practical and enjoyable for both men and women. Shop safety is emphasized. Planning, determining costs and building projects comprise the 1st portion of this class. Students will choose projects with instructor approval. The course is offered in Power Junior High, Wednesdays, 7:10 p.m. Room A-5. Cost is \$15. Materials are extra.

BEGINNING BRIDGE (Goren) will cover hand counting, evaluation and bidding. Playing of hands interspersed with instruction. Class time and fee are: Tuesdays, 7:30-9:30 p.m. Room 104D; \$12.

INTERMEDIATE BRIDGE (Goren) offers prepared hands for those who have had the beginners course or playing experience. It meets Wednesdays, 7:30-9:30 p.m. Room 104D. Cost is \$12.

SQUARE DANCING II is a class for those who have square dancing experience. Dancers meet Wednesdays, 7:30-9:30 p.m. in the cafeteria. Course fee is \$12 per couple.

DRIVER EDUCATION FOR ADULTS is for those 18 and over and offers behind the wheel instruction in a dual control car. Individualized schedules will be arranged. Call the adult education office to make arrangements.

BASIC READING SKILLS FOR ADULTS will be geared to the needs of each student after testing. Emphasis will be on perceptual skills, word attack, spelling, vocabulary and comprehension skills. Class will meet in Farmington Junior High Mondays, 7-9 p.m. Room 213, for a \$12 fee.

Minutes of previous meeting were approved.

Minutes of other boards were received.

Request for variance to sign ordinance from David Chabon and David Bono of the
Seven Seas Tropical Fish Store, 3389 Grand River, was amended and granted.
Request for variance to sign ordinance from Jim Taylor, 3206 Grand River, grant-
ed.

Proclamation issued to Farmington Area Jaycees, proclaiming the week of Janu-
ary 5-11, 1976 as "OPERATION BUS WEEK" (Shuttle Up Below).

City Manager Dinsman reported on the proposed actions for controlling vandalism in
the Tall Oaks Subdivision and adjacent areas to residents of these subdivisions.
City Manager Dinsman was authorized to take bids for the purchase of One Police
Vehicle.

the city.

ORDINANCE NO. C48-75
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TRAFFIC CONTROL ORDERS

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:
That the Traffic Control Orders issued by the Chief of Police of the City of
Farmington dated February 4, 1972 are hereby amended to add Section 7.3 to Chap-
ter 7, as provided for in Section 2.52 of the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Towns,

7.3 Alley Way located between 2845 Grand River and 2841 Grand River, Farm-
ington, Michigan
(a) from Grand River South, the Alley Way shall be "One Way"

This ordinance was declared to be an emergency ordinance which is immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety.

This ordinance was introduced, adopted and enacted at a Regular meeting of the
Farmington City Council on December 15, 1975 and will become effective immedi-
ately.
