The subcontractor said for an injunction to stop the picketing, charging it was a secondary boyocit prohibited by the 1947 Taft-Hartley Act, and won in a National Labor Relations Board decision.

A secondary boyocit exists when a union persuades a person (the general contractor) to cease doing business with a second person (the non-union firm).


