Outreach hearing is slated

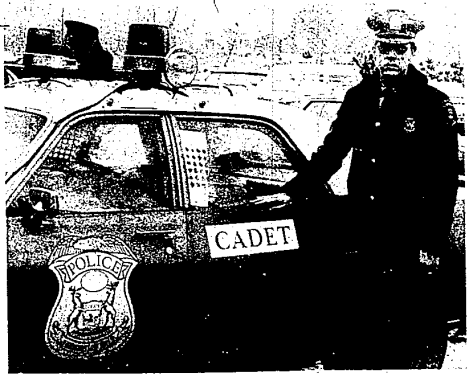
FARMINGTON An open meeting to answer community questions on Outreach Clinic, a free medical clinic for Farmington young people, will be held Thursday, Jan. 31, at 7:30 p.m. at Cloverdale School, located on Freedom Rd. between Farmington and Meridian Rds.

"Anyone who wants to find out more about the philosophy of the clinic, the types of service it will offer or who has any questions on its functions is invited to attend," said John Strokamp, program coordinator.

It is anticipated the federally funded program will open in early March. It is intended to reach young people, especially drug users, who are reluctant to visit the family physician or established clinics for treatment of health problems.

The public meeting also is aimed at introducing Carol Duggan, a registered nurse who has been hired as the clinic administrator.

Those who already feel a desire to volunteer their services may learn what role they can play, Strokamp said. Needed are nurses, student nurses, medical students and lay counselors, he said.

Cadets patrol Hills streets

FARMINGTON - neighborhood streets and taking routine reports are some of the duties assigned the cadets in the Farmington Hills Police Department, according to Ronald Holko, director of public safety.

The federal grant of approximately \$28,000 per year adds four cadets to the department. They work for \$2.60 an hour, plus college tuition, in a work-study program.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS FARMINGTON HILLS CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING AND PUBLIC HEARING January 14, 1974

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington Hills was conducted January 14, 1974, at the Farmington Hills Administration Building. All members of the Council were present. The Public Hearing concerning the new Zoning Ordinance 624 was well attended. Mayor McConnell said that the proposed Ordinance had been under study since adoption of the Master Plan three years ago.

Request for vacation of streets were approved, as follows: 1. Request #C41-673, Grand Gardens Subdivision, Section 26 and Sup. Sub #1, alley between lots 4, 5 and 6 of Sup. Sub #1 and lot 9 of Grand Gardens.

2. Request #C41-672, Tarzahn Roseland Gardens Section 23, alley between lots 8 thru 20, 24 & 26. Robert #C41-671, Grand River Creek Subdivision in Section 26, Independence Avenue from Ontario to 139.25 East, bordering lots 4 & 416 of Grand River Creek, was approved for one month, allowing further consideration.

A donation of \$50.00 to the Grove-Walker Unit, American Legion Auxiliary, was authorized to assist in sponsoring a delegate to the Grand State Convention. The City Manager submitted a list of architects for consideration by the Council in planning the addition to City Hall.

In accordance with approval from the Secretary of State's office, plans are being formulated for the Special Census to be undertaken by the City. Gladys Thomas was named chairperson.

Ordinance C42, Prohibiting Obstruction was introduced, specifically defining areas of control and empowering the City to enforce certain U.S. Supreme Court rulings.

The City Manager was authorized to secure bids for the proposed construction of a sufficient amount of the Northern water system to serve the City Ponye Drake Farms subdivision.

Pursuant to zoning board recommendations, the Council approved renewal of a junk yard license for 2000 Magerty Road, as requested by William King. The City Engineer was directed to prepare plans and cost estimate for rear yard drainage in part of Woodstream Farms Subdivision. A necessary hearing for this improvement was scheduled for February 11, 1974.

Preparation of plans and cost estimate for Hollywood Subdivision sewer for Springbrook and Hayes Street from Ten Mile to Fish were authorized. A three-man Board of Review was appointed in accordance with Section 706 of the Charter. Named to a two-year term was Robert Duggan, three-year term were Andrew Siroka, and one-year term Harold Lam.

A Public Hearing on vacating Shawansee from Nine Mile to Middlebelt is scheduled for February 11, 1974. Ordinance C43, rezoning Section 11 (parcel #11 from RA-2 to RC-1, and parcel #1) from RA-2 to RA-3, property located on Drake Road and Nine Mile South of I-96, was introduced and public hearing scheduled for February 11, 1974.

Ordinance C43, rezoning Section 14 located on the South side of Twelve Mile just west of Middlebelt, from RA-2 and D to D-1-B-1, was introduced and public hearing set for February 11, 1974.

Ordinance C43A, rezoning property in Section 18 located on the West side of Oakland Road and North of Hollywood Court, from RA-2 to L-1, was introduced and public hearing set for February 11, 1974.

The meeting was adjourned following motion to authorize publication of a summary of the Zoning Ordinance C42.
