## Cross country wrap-up

# Lathrup tops Eagles

Lathrup runners took the top three spots as the Chargers defeated Ulica Eisenhower, 19-37, last Thursday in a Metro Suburban Association cross country meet at Lawrence Institute of Technology last Thursday. Lathrup is 5-2 overall.

John Harding finished first in 16:23. Steve Foley (15:49) and Mike Driscoll (17:03) completed the three-deep sweep. Lathrup's Dave Clifford finished fifth in 17:25, while teammate Mitch Cohen took eighth in 17:55.

**Farmington-Stevenson**  
Farmington High made it seven straight cross country victories this season by stopping Livonia Stevenson, 20-41, in an Inter Lakes League meet last week.

Stevenson, the defending ILL cross country champ, took first place with Ken Brown's 15:35. Farmington's Al VanMeter was second in 15:56. Falcons Stu Glatfelter and Larry Otto took third and fourth respectively.

Farmington will participate in the ILL meet next Thursday (Oct. 17) at Highland Lakes Community College.

**N. Farmington-Oak Park**  
North Farmington took the first five places and defeated Oak Park, 15-47, in a Northwest Suburban League cross country meet last week. The runners in order of finish: Dave Good (18:45), Dave Levy (16:54), Carl Davis (17:11), Mike Carney (17:42), and Dan Morris (17:57). **RU Invitational**  
Farmington High finished second at the Redford Union Invitational cross country meet last week at Cass Benton Park. Farmington scored 106 points, 14 more than first-place Dearborn Edsel Ford. West Bloomfield finished third with 130 points, and Dearborn High took fourth with 173. Southfield High's Scott Stone finished seventh in 16:10. Farmington's Al VanMeter was ninth (16:15). Farmington's Stu Glatfelter was 18th (16:22). Southfield-Lathrup's Steve Foley was 14th (16:23), and Farmington's Craig Bloomer was 16th (16:32).

Southfield High swimmers finished first in eight of 11 events and defeated Hazel Park, 80-70, in a Southeastern Michigan Association meet last Thursday. The victory was Southfield's first in five tries.

"It was a good meet," said Southfield coach Ginny Schalm, who has only 14 girls on her team. "Hazel Park has about the same number of kids as we do, so we had someone to compete against. When we compete against teams with 40 or 50 kids, there's not much we can do. They can put fresh swimmers in all the time, while my kids are tired."

Lynn Avery, Karen Dunaski and Janice Ouellette were double winners for Southfield. Miss Avery won the 100-yard freestyle (1:21.6) and the 200 free (2:34.7). Miss Dunaski won the 100 butterfly (1:23.9) and the 200 individual medley (2:38.6). Miss Ouellette won the 50 free (:31.6) and the 100 breaststroke (1:27.3).

Southfield's 200 Medley Relay finished first in 2:30.7. The team consists of Kim York, Miss Ouellette, Miss Avery and Miss Dunaski. Miss York won the 100 backstroke in 1:26.9.

Farmington Our Lady of Mercy trounced Grosse Pointe Star of the Sea, 64-19, last Thursday in Catholic League girls' swimming meet. The victory was the fourth straight this season for DeLoris Yager's Mercy girls.




