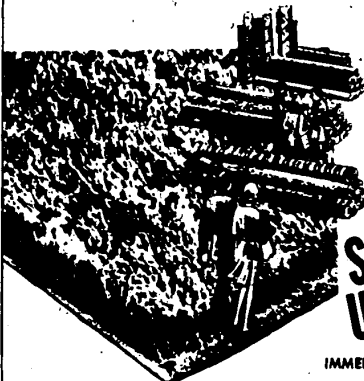
CLARA MARY NORTHMORE
