

# Break winter boredom with day classes

The Farmington Community Education program will offer a variety of daytime classes for adults at Bond School, Thirteen Mile at Orchard Lake roads.

Classes start the week of Jan. 12 and most, but not all, run 10 weeks. **ART ODDS 'N ENDS** offers students a means of creative expression through various easy art projects—bath, tie dye, silk screen, painting, weaving, batik fiber exchange, wire jewelry and small clay articles. Tuesday, 10 a.m.-noon, 10 weeks, \$15 plus \$6 materials fee.

**BEGINNING BELLY DANCING** is an opportunity to learn the art form while toning muscles. Use of the veil and cymbals is included. Wear a body suit or leotard. Thursday, 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. 10 weeks, \$15.

**BELLY DANCING FOR INTERMEDIATES** is for those who have had the beginning class. Thursday, 12:45-1:45 p.m. 10 weeks, \$15.

**BRIDGE, BEGINNING** (Goren) covers hand courting, evaluation, bidding and playing of hands. It is for those new to the game. Bring a deck of cards. Monday, 10 a.m.-noon, 10 weeks.

**BRIDGE INTERMEDIATE** (Goren) is for those who have had the beginning course playing experience. Play will be preceded by a review of bidding, fundamentals, lead play and defense instruction. Bring cards. Monday, 1-3 p.m. 10 weeks, \$15.

**CAKE DECORATING** will include icing techniques, creation of flowers, children's cakes and seasonal ones. Thursday, 9:30-11:30 a.m., 10 weeks \$15 plus materials.

**CERAMICS** is a basic course in ceramic techniques using clay. Hand-built techniques are taught, no greenware. Decoration and glazing are in-

cluded. Bring a plastic bag and handkerchief or oil cloth to first class. Monday, 10 a.m.-noon, 10 weeks, \$15 plus materials.

**COOKING, QUICK 'N EASY GOURMET** begins Jan. 22 and runs for nine weeks. Students will make crepes, souffles, fish and meat dishes and flaming desserts. Thursday, 12:30-2:30 p.m. \$15 plus \$4 materials materials fee due at the first meeting.

**COUCHING/INTERMEDIATE** is for those with some basic knowledge. Bring your current project or a size F book and a skein of white yarn. Thursday, 1-3 p.m. Six weeks, \$19.

**CPR CARDIO-PULMONARY RESUSCITATION** is presented through the Michigan Heart Association. It will meet Tuesday, Feb. 3, and Tuesday, Feb. 10, 9:30-11:30 a.m. both days. CPR is the method of mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and external heart massage that forces the heart to pump blood to prevent brain damage. Attendance at both sessions is required.

**DRAPERY MAKING** is instruction in buying appropriate yardage and making stirred curtains and pleated draperies. Wednesday, 9:30-11:30, 10 weeks, \$15.

**DRAWING AND SKETCHING** is an exploration of drawing methods and materials with emphasis on composition and design. Bring 19 inch by 24 inch newsprint pad and soft pencils to class. Wednesday, 10-noon, \$15.

**DRIED FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS** includes discussion of selection and preservation of natural materials. Students will make several ar-

rangements. Friday 10 a.m.-noon, eight weeks. The cost is \$12 plus materials.

**DRIED FLOWER-CRAFT WORKSHOPS** is a structured class in which students will make specific accessories for the home. Projects will in-

clude a basket on a board, arrangement in a box, fruit arrangements and an all-around dried flower arrangement. Bring scissors and wire clippers. Materials may be bought from the instructor. Monday, 1-3 p.m. eight weeks, \$12 plus materials.

## Salt useful mineral in fighting evil

"Ought ye not to know that the Lord God of Israel gave the kingdom over Israel to David forever, even to him and his sons by a covenant of salt."

1 Chronicles 13:3 Because of its ability to preserve foods, salt became the symbolic enemy of decay and evil.

It is referred to again and again in mythology as well as European folk and fairy tales.

A Christian symbol of perfect understanding and divine wisdom, salt is also an element of the holy water used in blessings and exorcisms.

Salt has always played an important role in customs associated with birth, marriage and death. A pinch of salt is still sometimes placed in a new-



born baby's bed to protect it from evil until it receives the protection of baptism. And many churches use salt in their baptism or christening rituals.

PEOPLE USED to immerse extracted teeth in salt before disposing of them so that if those teeth ever fell into the hands of enemies, they could not be used against them.

You may remember that in the tales of the Arabian Nights, the chief of the tribe of thieves refused to rat salt in the home of Ali Baba because it would establish a bond between them.

Salt plays its part in the rites of death, protecting the newly departed from evil spirits. The ancient Irish placed a plate of salt on the corpse, and in early America salt was placed in the room in which someone had died to "purge the sins of the deceased, and ease the journey of the soul."

Salt placed in a coffin symbolizes the soul's survival, incorruptibility and eternity.

The sexual symbolism of salt was one of great importance. It has been said that cavemen first discovered the joys of kissing by licking the salty perspiration from the skins of their mates.

IT IS STILL considered good luck for the mother of a bride to give a gift of salt to the newlyweds.
