

# Garden City East nips North in 2 OTs

Garden City East, trailing the entire game, connected for the equalizing points on a field goal by center Greg Emery to tie the score very late in the final period, and two overtimes later, the Panthers found themselves on the long end of a 71-70 count against North Farmington Friday in Northwest Suburban play.

North Farmington, which carried a 24 conference record into the contest, effectively defeated one of East's two big guns, Jim Riley, but the Panthers finally got support from the rest of the cast to pick up the slack. Riley, normally a prolific scorer, got into foul trouble against the Raiders and counted only nine points.

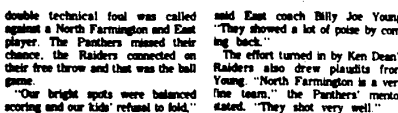

# Harrison drops key WSL game

Happy days could be coming again for coach Pat Montagano and his Livonia Churchill basketball team. Churchill reigned as Western Six League basketball champs for three straight years before being dethroned by Northville High last season. But Churchill has a strong squad this season, and the Chargers are alone on top of the Western Six standings after beating Farmington Harrison, 62-56, last Friday on the Hawks' court.
