

# Harrison rips Plymouth Canton, 71-59

Boasting the best defense in the Western Six conference, the Farmington Harrison Hawks strayed a hasty Plymouth Canton Chief team Friday evening, 71-59, in a way in contention for a possible league championship with Livonia Central.

Harrison opened up a 12-4 lead with the scoring spread around the starting five players.

Throughout the night the Hawks concentrated on balanced scoring to keep the Chiefs defense off guard.

With the Hawks playing a man-to-man defense, Canton made several turnovers in the first half. This kept them from taking the lead when they were within two points.

Harrison stretched its lead to 21-18 with 8:00 left in the half as the rebounding Mike Stiles complimented the shooting of Mark Brock and Mike Stover.

Canton, playing in spurts, picked up the hot hand for the next four minutes and cut the Harrison deficit to 23-21 with 2:14 left in the half.

BILL PARSON, a 62 senior forward was largely responsible for the Chiefs revival during that span in the second quarter.

Parson hit five points with two field goals coming on follow up shots while clearing the boards with some rugged defensive play.

Just when Canton rallied from a deficit and seemed to have the momentum in its favor, Harrison's defense would force the Chiefs to take another low percentage shot.

We were taking just a shot from bad angles, said Canton coach Gary Cavell. While the Chiefs hit an next 37 per cent.

MIKE NYLEN paid for his hands-on effort against Farmington in the second quarter as he led both teams in rebounds.

The last Canton basket came after the Chiefs trailed away an eight-point lead in the final three minutes to give the Hawks a victory.

This time around, it was Canton who was missing most of its starting members.

Both Stover and Bill Pearson came with a severe sprained ankle suffered in the Canton game with Livonia last Saturday. It was believed that they would miss the next two games.
