West led the eight of hearts. The hand in the diagram is June's favorite hand of the tournament. Edith's response to the opening heart bid is the Jacoby two notrump — a forcing game of unlimited strength.

June's three spade call showed a singleton spade. Edith checked for aces and bid the small slam.

South won the heart lead in her hand, cashed the two high clubs and trumped a spade. She ruffed her last club and another spade.

Now June drew the outstanding trump. She led a small diamond and finessed the nine! East won the trick with the ten, but was caught in a hopeless situation. She only had diamonds in her hand and had to lead into dummy's ace-queen.

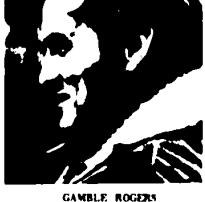
