Regional recreation facts

Facts to remember about the Harco County Metropolitan Park Authority:
 • Sanctioned by the Michigan State Legislature in Act 147 of the Public Acts of 1939.
 • Approved by the citizens of the counties of Livingston and Macomb (Oakland, Washburn and Wayne in the general election of Nov. 3, 1940 with the vote 2 to 1 in favor of the authority.
 • Governed by a seven-member board of commissioners with one each elected or appointed by the County Board of Commissioners to represent the county they serve and in which they must reside, and two appointed by the governor to represent the district at large. The original commission met in May 1941 with its first official board meeting held May 28, 1941.
 • Began collecting taxes in 1942 in 1/2 mill rate 25 cents per \$1,000 upon each dollar of the state equalized assessed value of the property of the five counties in the district, named George W. McVicker as Engineer-Director and hired its first staff.
 • Opened its first Metropolitan Park near Milford covering 430 acres.
 • Added other parks in the 1950's—Metro Beach Metropolitan Park near Pontiac, Marshbank Metropolitan Park near Belleville and Dexter Huron Metropolitan Park near Ann Arbor.
