Community Living Services.

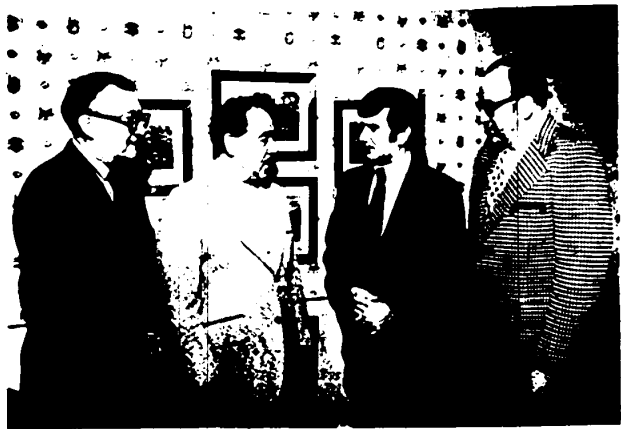
She is a member of the board for the National Association of Private Residential Facilities for the Mentally Retarded.

The Farmington Area YMCA now is accepting registrations for March session programs which start this week.

The Farmington Y located at 2810 Farmington Road will offer more than 100 classes ranging from aquatics to drivers education.

This season traditionally has a high enrollment and anyone interested in attending can register by calling the YMCA at 614-2222.

A new parent-in dance movement exploration class will be taught by Mrs. Marteen Vongerichan, an expert in theater and dance. The class will be 9:30 to 10 a.m. Fridays.

Another new program will be diaper exercise in the swimming pool from 10:15-10:45 a.m. on Thursdays.

Other creative classes, gym, swim and art courses round out the pre-school program.

The YMCA also will offer beginning, intermediate and advanced swimming classes for all age levels. Small classes are desired and will be taught by certified instructors.

Life saving and Red Cross certification will be on Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:30. Students must be at least 15 years old.

Using its four indoor tennis courts, the YMCA will offer more than 30 tennis classes

taught by UNITS professional instructors.

A new addition for the March session will be a seven-week evening class designed for intermediate players who wish to improve their game.

Physical activities available include ice skating Saturdays, Figure Skating, belly dancing, yoga and fitness classes will be offered to fit a variety of needs.

New classes include: handwriting for girls in grades 2-5. The class will be at 6:15 p.m. on Tuesdays and will emphasize the beginning strokes and the four methods.

A new women's creative dance class will combine dance, Tai Chi, fitness and body language on Friday evenings from 10:15-11 p.m.

James Hafler has led the Farmington YMCA's gymnastic team to four Greater Metropolitan Championships in the past four years.

In order to expand the program to meet the growing community involvement, the YMCA will offer classes at Westbrook Elementary School, 21100 Utopia in Livonia and at Kenbrook Elementary School, 20130 Kenwood Hill in the Kenilworth Subdivision.

The YMCA also will offer four dancing

craft workshops in the community room. The first session will be on Monday, March 5, and the last on Saturday, March 11. The classes will be held in the community room of the YMCA.
