

Lathrup skates past Southfield, 10-4

High school hockey is in its fourth year in Southfield. For the first three seasons, Southfield High was considered the coming team. Hapless Southfield-Lathrup lost 43 games and tied six before finally winning late last season.

But there's a new deal this season. Lathrup is respectable. Southfield is down.

Lathrup lifted its Suburban Hockey League record to 7-3-1 by beating Southfield, 10-4, last Thursday before a packed house at Southfield's Beechwoods Arena. The loss dropped Southfield to 1-12 in the league.

"That game was closer than the score showed," said Lathrup coach Dave Butler. "In fact, Southfield outshot us, 28-29, but our kids were more accurate. They were picking the corners, setting up nice plays and taking advantage of Southfield's mistakes."

Lathrup put the game away early by outscoring Southfield 7-1 in the first period. Lathrup's Ken Isaacson, a senior right winger, lined in three more scoring plays. Kevin Kowalski, Steve Montemurri and Ron Broadbery also found the range in the opening period.

Southfield had problems defending its goal, admitted coach Art Carlin.

(In offense we did not do badly," he said. "The main reason for our defeat was our goaltending. In the first period, Lathrup took 11 shots and scored seven goals. Tom Morgan, Southfield's goalie, just fell apart."

CARCINI REPLACED Morgan with Mark Kovac, and things were a bit more even for the last two-thirds of the game.

The teams traded goals in the second period with Mark Hamill scoring for Lathrup and Joe Bonadaro scoring for the Blue Jays. Montemurri and Kowalski each scored third-period goals for Lathrup, while Southfield's Ed Walsh scored a pair to go with a first-period goal.

The hat trick was the first of the season for Walsh, a junior right winger. "His main forte is that he's a hard digger just a good hard player," Carlick said. "He doesn't have the greatest talent, but he makes up for it with hard work."

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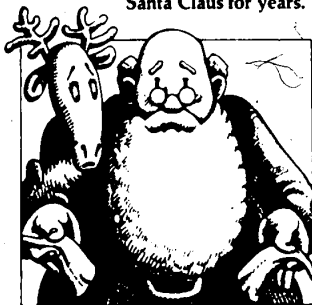
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
