## Sacred music concert set at Baptist church

Maranatha Baptist Bible College Choral of Watertown, Wis. will present a concert of sacred music at First Baptist Church of Farmington, 3340 Shawwassee, Friday, April 9 at 7:30 p.m. The 17-voice group is under direction of Harold DeGraw, chairman of the college music department. A variety of choral sections and small ensemble numbers, both vocal and instrumental, will be featured. The program will open with "Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee" arranged by Simone; "Let All the Nations Praise the Lord," arranged by Hoggard; "Go Ye Into All the World," by McCormick and "Trumpet Voluntary," by Purcell, arranged by Pollock. A collection of patriotic songs will follow: "God of Our Fathers"; "America the Beautiful"; and the "Battle Hymn of the

Republic." The majestic "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" will conclude this section. "With the Voice Singing" (Shaw) and several other gospel hymn arrangements, such as "Jesus Paid It All" (Quintanilha) will climax the message of the program. Director DeGraw, also a baritone soloist, will sing several numbers supported by the choir including one of his own arrangements "What Will You Do With Jesus?" Dr. Myron Cedarholm, president and founder, will accompany the singing group and conclude the program with a message. Maranatha is a coeducational Baptist Bible college training young people for Christian service. Enrollment of 676 includes members of the graduate school. An academy of grades 1-12 has an enrollment of 172.
