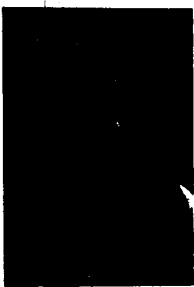


Larsen-Wasco

Everything's roses at center seminar

Forrest Geary will lecture on the care and culture of roses in Farmington Community Center Friday, April 9. Continental breakfast will be served at 9:30 a.m. before the lecture.

Geary will offer expert advice on: rose varieties that grow best in the Detroit area; selection of vigorous plants; pruning techniques; fertilizing; removing winter protection; prevention of blackspot; disbudding; control of wild growth and preparing roses for bouquet shows; a special seminar on "Outstanding Consulting Rosarians" of the Great Lakes district for 1974. He is president of the Detroit Rose Society and an officer or member of several other groups devoted to rose culture.

Geary has judged state and national shows, and grows 400 varieties of bushes, many of them imported not generally available to American rose growers.

Wine continues lecture series

"Bertrand Russell: A New Biography" will be the second lecture by Rabbi Sherwin Wine in his series "Pioneers of Modern Humanism." to be given at 8:30 p.m. Friday, April 9. The lecture will be at the Birmingham Temple, 2861 West Twelve Mile, Farmington.

"If humanism were silly enough to lecture prophets or saints," says Rabbi Wine, "Bertrand Russell would be one of them."

"No philosopher of the 20th century wrote so much, so well, on so many subjects. Russell's aristocratic flip offended some and charmed others. The power of his mind and personality made humanism visible and attractive. We ought to know more about him."
