

# Deano Day chairs May 8 Bike-a-thon

Deano Day of WDEE radio is chairman of the American Diabetes Association's 1976 Bike-a-thon, set this year for Saturday, May 8.

Sponsor sheets which contain rules and routes are available now in all Jack in the Box restaurants, ready for the 15,000 bikers who are expected to peddle throughout the state.

The bike-a-thon is the biggest fund raiser of the Michigan affiliate of the national association. Money raised will go toward diabetes research, help and education for diabetics, and Camp Midicha, which gives diabetic youth a camping experience and helps them learn to care for themselves.

Bikers have their choice of seven different mapped routes within the metropolitan area, with check points along the way.

Three 10-speed bikes will be awarded to the top money collector in three age categories, when all donations are in. Free hamburgers, fries and soft drinks will be given to each rider who completes one en-

# Polynesian evening set to boost research

A Polynesian evening is planned Sunday, May 23, to benefit the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. The festivities will be held in the Royal House, Thirteen Mile east of Van Dyke, in Warren.

The host will be a dream come true for Ida Mangaravali of St. Clair Shores, a diabetic, and her husband, Tony. This is their way of making a sizable contribution toward finding a cure for diabetes.

The Mangaravali selected the Michigan chapter of the foundation to be the recipient of the proceeds of the luncheon because the foundation's primary goal is to raise funds toward finding a cure for the disease.

Under the direction of Dr. Leonard Wayne, president of the chapter and a Southfield resident, the group directed more than 43 per cent of its funds directly

into research programs. The disease just recently has been declared the third largest killer of Americans, and it is a leading cause of blindness and a leading cause of kidney and circulatory problems.

With the announcement of a cutoff in state funding for diabetes research, future progress in this field will largely depend upon obtaining funds through benefits of this kind.

The evening will get under way with cocktails at 4 p.m. followed by a Polynesian buffet at 5 p.m. The Aunty-More Band and a Hawaiian review will provide entertainment.

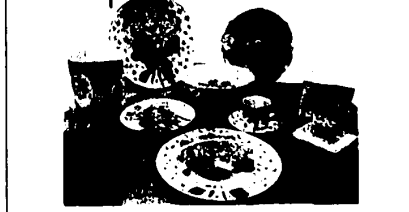

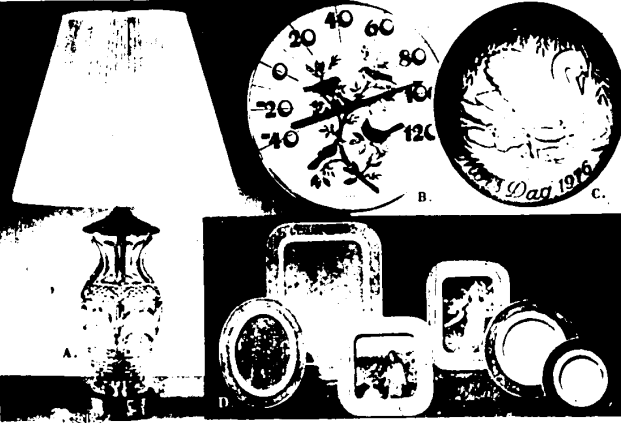

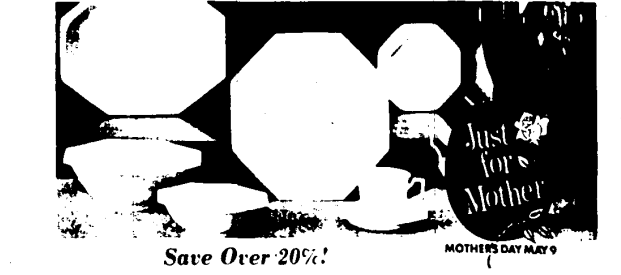
