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Jays outrun Ferndale

Southfield track coach Chuck Basing had said the team's success this season would depend a lot on some untied sophomores. So far, the sophs have been coming through. Southfield is 5-0 in the Southwestern Michigan Association after its 51-51 victory over Ferndale last Thursday night.

In other track meets last week, Farmington lifted its later Lakes League mark to 4-0 with a 74-57 1/4 win over Milford Lakeland. Farmington's Harrison topped Plymouth Canton, 82-49, in the Western Six League. North Farmington blasted Garden City East, 108-38, in a Northwest Suburban League meet. Birmingham Groves defeated Southfield-Lathrup, 58-34.

Southfield sophomores Ken Raby and Dave Walmsworth were double winners against Ferndale. Raby won the 120 high hurdles in 1:5.3, and the 100 low hurdles in 30.8. Walmsworth won the shot put with a 42.4 toss, and the discus with a 109-4 1/2 throw.

Basing is enthusiastic about his young crew, especially Raby.

"Raby has been running so well," the coach said, "he seems to be better every time he goes out. He's going to be sensational if he keeps it up. That 1:5 in the high hurdles is the fastest a sophomore has ever

run at Southfield. And that 30.8 (in the low) is a great time for a sophomore."

Earlier last week, Southfield beat Waterford, 85-47.

FARMINGTON'S BRIAN Sunstiff won individual events, and teammate Rick McKibben set a school record in the high jump to help the Falcons take care of Milford Lakeland.

Sunstiff, a senior, won the long jump (21-5 1/4), the low hurdles (1:21.8) and the 100 dash (10.5). McKibben, a sophomore, set the school standard in the high jump with a 6-7 1/4 effort. The old record was 6-2 set by Ned Durham in 1973.

Farmington won all five field events. Besides Sunstiff (long jump) and McKibben (high jump), Dennis Bona won the discus (116-1 1/4).

Kevin Hansen won the shot put (38-5 1/4) and Marty Popp won the pole vault (12-4). Two of Farmington's best runners, hurdler Mike Danne and miler Stuart Glatfelter, were injured and didn't run against Lakeland.

The victory left Farmington at 5-2 overall.

Jeff Thorne, Mike Bowden and Mike Coleman each won two individual events to

lead Harrison point. Coach Coleman won the high jump (5-4) and the pole vault (11-8). Bowden took the long jump (17-9) and the shot put (45-9 1/4), and Thorne topped the high hurdles (1:32.2) and the low hurdles (1:21.8).

Harrison is 3-4 overall and 1-2 in the Western Six.

North Farmington is 3-4 overall and 1-1 in the Northwest Suburban League after its victory over Garden City East. "We got more of our confidence back today," said Ed Davis, North's assistant track coach. "We're weak, but East is a disaster."

North won 14 of the 18 events, including the 120 high hurdles where Alex Hampson won 17.8. Earlier last week, Waterford Mott defeated North, 85-47.

Birmingham Groves has been beating everyone by big scores this season. Lathrup, however, had some good performances in a losing effort. Gary Hawthorne set a school record in the high jump with a 6-1 1/4 jump. Groves' Dan Paulsen, the defending MSA champion in the high jump, was second at 6-1.

Lathrup's Brian Gould won two events, tying a school mark in the 100-4 (30.1), and winning the 200 (1:22.9).

The loss dropped Lathrup to 3-4 overall, 0-3 in the MSA.

SL girls top Southfield

Southfield-Lathrup's girls' track team lifted its record to 7-1 with victories over Birmingham Groves and Southfield High last week. The Chargers, coached by Mike Murphy, defeated Groves, 86-38, and Southfield, 69-31.

In another girls' track meet last week, Milford Lakeland stopped Farmington High, 67-48, last Thursday.

Against Groves, Lathrup's Joanna Jacobs won the 100-yard dash in 12.8, and teammate Rhonda Finkelstein took the 400 in 1:41.

Lathrup won 12 of the 14 events against Southfield. Jacobs won three events—the high jump (5-0), the 100 dash (12.3) and the 220 dash (38.7)—and also ran on the Chargers' 400 relay, which won in 34.9. Bridget Mullane and Rhonda Finkelstein each won two events for Lathrup. Mullane took the long jump (14-6) and the 110 hurdles (1:17.2), while Finkelstein won the 400 (1:32.3) and the 800 (2:35.4).
