WEST BLOOMFIELD YOUTH ASSISTANCE

ANCE works toward the prevention of juvenile delinquency and self-abuse, and needs volunteers in several areas. The One-to-One committee matches adult volunteers with children aged 8-17. The volunteer acts as a big brother or sister and meets with the child at least once a week. A six week training program is provided. The Youth Employment Committee needs volunteers to help find jobs for junior high school students. The Case Student Committee needs trained volunteers to review cases handled by the juvenile court and assist with the rehabilitation of the youth. The Parent Education Program needs volunteers to help parents become more involved in the prevention of youth problems. The Membership Committee needs volunteers interested in bringing new people to the program.

Contest adds category

Amateur writers can win cash awards in the newly expanded fourth annual creative writing contest sponsored by the English department of the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College.

The contest now includes a script category in addition to the traditional short story, poetry, essay or article and drama categories.

The contest is open to all Oakland County residents and students, except professional writers or members of the OCC faculty and staff. Deadline for submission of manuscripts is June 1. Ten cash awards, five for high school students and five for all others, will be announced June 25. Manuscripts will be judged by the Orchard Ridge English faculty.

Ten Rancom, contest coordinator, said the new Script category recognizes the growing importance of creative writing in non-traditional forms. "This category includes writing for motion pictures, slides and videotape plus hybrid mixed-media forms."

Manuscripts must be accompanied by a \$1 entrance fee, which helps pay for the prizes.
