Reject Grievance

By unanimous vote, Schoolcraft College's board of trustees denied the grievance request of instructors John S. Kyriacopoulos and Michaell A. O'Toole, Jr., stemming from their signatures in an algestly dossene "posters of board deliberiation in executive session. Trustee Sam Hudson sponsored the resolution and Trustee Clarke Oldenburg seconded the motion. Absent was James Boswell.

By denying the request, the board supported the earlier recommendation of College President Dr. Eric Bradner made at the April 29 meeting. "The administration colamb at none of the material placed in the grievants' files has been placed in violation of the Master Contract." Dr. Bradner said.

Both Kyriacopoulos and O'Toole along with autorney Bernard Fieger, counsel for the Faculty Forum, accepted the decision silently and immediately left the meeting.

IN HIS EXPLANATORY statements to the board at the beginning of the discussion, Fleger cited two alleged breaches of contract by the college.

One was the violation of the grievants' rights as private citizens, the attorney said. The second was two-fold and dealt with the administration's failure to keep all discussions of the matter confidential and the alleged improper placement in the two teachers' files of a letter of reprimand and a copy of the document in question.
