A lecturer, writer and consultant, Dr. Murray has appeared as an expert witness in financial hearings.

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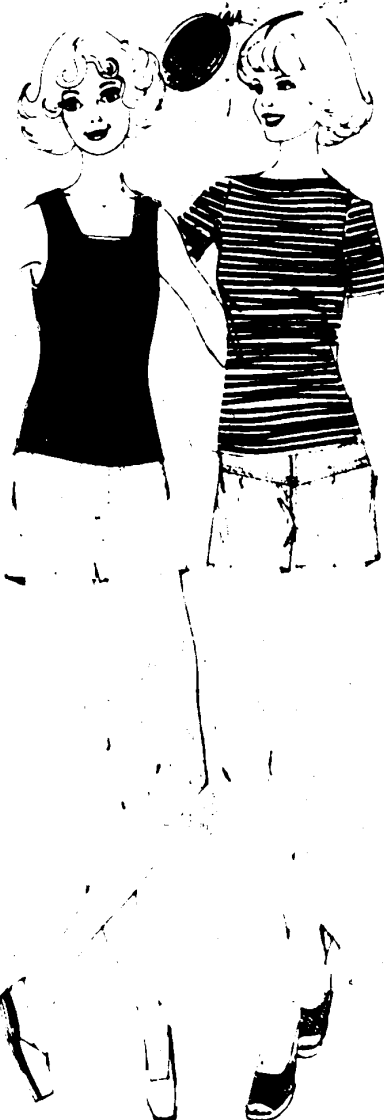
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
