Brines 'knighted'

Virgil LeRoy Brines, of 1827 Floral, Livonia, has been designated a "Knight of the York Cross of Honor." This honorary degree, highest in the York Right of Freemasonry, is conferred only on those who have held the highest office in each of the four bodies of the rite. Brines is one of about 400 men who will qualify for the award this year among more than 4 million international Freemasons. Brines served as master of the Waverly Lodge of Masons in 1959, was high priest of the Redford chapter, Royal Arch Masons in 1970, master of the Northville Council in 1973, commander of the Redford commandery, Knight Templar in 1966. He was elected to membership in the Michigan priory and his election was confirmed by the convent general of the order May 1976.

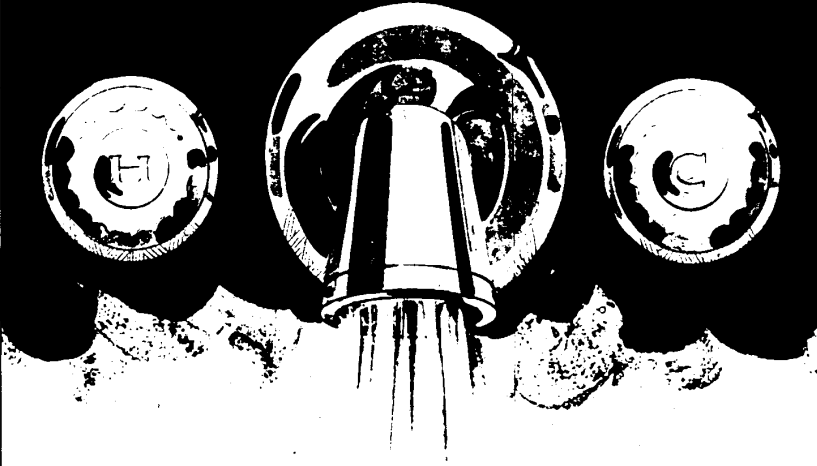
