

2 New Priests Ordained

The new priests are: Fr. Stanley J. Krogulecki and Fr. Dennis M. Fallon.

Following the memorial service and the sacrament of communion at 7:30 p.m. he will conduct the Uniting Conference of the new Detroit Annual Conference, drawing together the former Evangelical United Brethren and former Methodist churches located in the eastern part of the lower peninsula and in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

district superintendents, including Joseph T. Edwards of the Ann Arbor district and Jesse R. DeVitt, of the West Detroit district.

Lamb, now pastor of Monroe Methodist Church; and Gerald H. Kallermann, now superintendent of East Michigan EUB District.
