

Huron Hunt, Fish Club Will Expand Facilities

Rezoning has been approved for the Huron Valley Hunt and Fish Club, located in the city at 9 Mile and Farmington Rd., to build a clubhouse facility.

The City Council has approved the rezoning from residential to an educational research office (ERO) district. The ERO zoning will allow the group to build a one-story rustic clubhouse which will be surrounded by trees in the middle of their property.

The parking area, now directly off of Farmington Rd., will be moved inside the property closer to the clubhouse.

AT THE SAME meeting, the council granted rezoning to multiple for eight lots on the northeast corner of Hawthorne and Shiloh. Developers plan on building a two-story French provincial structure housing 14 apartment units. The council also gave permission to change the sign on

the present Detroit Edison office building at 33409 Grand River to bear the name of Bon Ton Gallery.

Bon Ton Shoppe will move an art gallery into the Edison building as soon as Edison moves its office to the store building formerly occupied by Henkel Dry Goods on Farmington Rd.

IN SEPARATE action, the council accepted the low bid of \$16,300 for the second phase of the relief sewer installation for the Bellaire Hills Subdivision. Offering the bid was the L&E Excavating Corporation.

The cost estimate for the project was \$15,000. Construction will involve 900 feet of 12-inch sewer pipe on Lamar from the sewer outlet to Beacon and 500 ft. north on Beacon. City Manager John Dinn reports there are sufficient funds in the improvement fund to absorb the \$1,300 additional cost over the engineer's estimate.

The council also agreed to purchase snorkel equipment for the Department of Public Safety. The equipment is a water tower which is placed atop a fire truck. It resembles a long tube, 50 feet high, with a hinge half-way up allowing the tower to bend.

Purpose of the water tower snorkel is to extinguish fires on top of buildings. It can go right into the fire, thus getting much closer than a firefighter on a ladder could.

Total purchase price is \$15,500 which is being financed with \$3,500 down and \$3,000 a year plus interest in four annual installments.

A RESOLUTION was adopted expressing the city's opposition to proposed legislation which would terminate tax exemptions on municipal bonds. "Such a change would have a very detrimental effect on all local governmental capital improvements," said Dinn, "creating a tremendous burden for local government to finance needed capital improvements and would create a tax burden on local citizens."

Copies were sent to Sens, Philip Hart and Robert Griffin

and Congressman William Broomfield, Jack McDonald and Wilbur Mills.

The council appointed Mrs. Peggy Schwaller, 2106 Lakespur, Chatham Hills, to the City Beautification Committee.

The council also adopted a resolution offered by John Richardson pledging the city's support for a Jaycee drive urging the unification of the American people to get behind peace efforts to obtain an honorable end to the Vietnam War. Copies of that resolution were forwarded to Wendell Smith, national Jaycee president, and Sens. William Fulbright, Ted Kennedy, Gene McCarthy, Paul McGovern, Hart and Griffin.

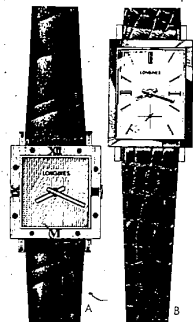
