YMCA Schedules 'Backyard' Swim

Farmington Area YMCA will begin registration for its annual "backyard" swimming program at 9:30 a.m. June 16 in the YMCA on Grand River just east of Drake.

An early registration for YMA members will be held at 9:30 a.m. June 14.

Instruction is open to boys and girls who are 48 inches tall and six years old by July 1. Classes begin June 30 and conclude Aug. 1.

Cost for the five-week session of 10 lessons is \$9. YMA membership is required. An annual YMA youth membership is \$5.

Several special programs are included in the series: Lifesaving classes begin June 27 with junior and senior life-saving instruction for those 12 years old and older. The course includes 16 hours of instruction and will meet from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in a private pool. Course fee is \$17 which includes a lifesaving manual. YMA membership is required.

A course for youngsters three to five years old and their mothers will be offered at 3 p.m. each Monday and Wednesday for five weeks beginning June 30. Mothers will join their children in the pools. Course fee is \$9 for YMA members, \$11.50 for non-members.

A class for adult women who do not know how to swim or have very little swimming ability will be offered Fridays from 1 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., beginning June 27. Course fee is \$9 for YMA members, \$11.50 for non-members.

Class times and locations include: beginners, Monday and Wednesday, 9:30 a.m. at Wildwood Trail; beginners, Monday and Wednesday 10:30 a.m. at Brookview; beginners, Monday and Wednesday at 11:30 a.m. on W. Nine Mile; advanced beginners on Monday and Wednesday at 1 p.m. on State; intermediate on Monday and Wednesday at 2 p.m. on Old Hometown; try
