## SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS COUNCIL MEETING

April 25, 1977

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in Regular Session at City Hall on April 25, 1977. Mayor Deacon called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M. Council Members present were: Amori, Dolan, Dudley, Oppenheimer, and Smith. Mr. Lichtenman was absent due to business. City Manager Majors, Assistant City Clerk Thomas, and City Attorney Bibeau.

State Representative Wilbur V. Brotherton presented a memorial resolution adopted by the State Legislature to Mrs. Joseph T. Brennan, in memory of her husband, family, and friends attending the funeral. After Public Hearing, the vacation of Bond Blvd. from Milllane to Greenboro Streets was approved 5-1. Mayor Deacon opposed.

After Public Hearing, structure located at 21885 Greenacres Street declared dangerous and ordered demolished in accordance with Ordinance No. 8-23. Amended Ordinance No. 08-79 to rezone 4.81 acres from single family residential (RA-3) to Multiple Family Residential (RC2) use property located on the north side of 8 Mile Road between Glen and Rocky Creek Roads was unanimously enacted. Amended Ordinance No. 08-43 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (RC-4) multiple family residential use lots 79-87 of Glen Acres Subdivision located on the south side of 14 Mile Road between Northwestern Highway and Briarcrest Road unanimously enacted.

Amended Ordinance No. 08-43 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (OS-2) planned office service district use lots 2, 3, and 4 of Farmington Hills Subdivision located on the west side of Orchard Lake Road between Ten Mile and Rocky Creek Roads unanimously enacted. Amended Ordinance No. 08-44 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (OS-2) planned office service district use lot No. 1 of Farmington Hills Subdivision located on the west side of Orchard Lake Road between Ten Mile and Rocky Creek Roads unanimously enacted.

Amended Ordinance No. 08-41 to rezone 1.29 acres from (RA-3) single family residential use to (L-1) light industrial use property located between Ten Mile and Rocky Creek Roads and north of Eight Mile Road (State Fabricators, Inc.) unanimously enacted. Final plans for Farmington Green Subdivisions No. 3 and No. 3 located on the north side of 1/2 Mile Road and east of Drake Road including survey deposit of \$80,241.42 unanimously approved. Resolution recommending approval of House Bill No. 4069 (State reimbursement to local governments for mandated costs) by the State Legislature unanimously approved.

Claim C Major License requested by Foodmark, Inc. located on the north side of Grand River Avenue just west of 146 unanimously granted. One year extension of restaurant date unanimously granted to City Inspector Roland Pfanderhorst. Parade permit unanimously granted to Kenwood P.T.A. for Sunday May 1, 1977 in the Grandview Subdivision. City Manager was directed to arrange a time when Council could meet with representatives of the Public Administration Service of Chicago, and Flame and Moran of Southfield to review proposals to conduct a managerial audit of City operations. After discussion, the general consensus of the City Council was to recommend to the Michigan State Highway Commission at their public hearing on April 27, 1977, the City's support of extending Northwestern Highway northward to approximately the intersection of Siggel's and White Lake Road, and the extension of White Lake Road, as shown on the attached map. After Public Hearing, the extension of White Lake Road to 1/2 Mile Road to Maple Road. City Manager was directed to prepare preliminary budget figures regarding the establishment of a City-owned concrete recycling center. Meeting adjourned at 1:05 A.M.

April 18, 1977

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in Special Session at City Hall on April 18, 1977. Mayor Deacon called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M. After Public Hearing, Special Assessment Roll in amount of \$102,220 for road paving in Fleming's Round Park and Builders' Park Subdivisions was unanimously confirmed. After Public Hearing, the vacation of a portion of Lakes Park Drive in Colony 2 Park West Subdivision No. 3 was unanimously denied.

After Public Hearing, the vacation of a portion of Drake Road south of Eleven Mile Road was granted by a vote of 5 to 1. Mr. Lichtenman opposed. After Public Hearing, amending Ordinance No. 08-43 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (RC-2) multiple family residential use lots 74 through 81 of Glen Acres Subdivision located on the south side of 14 Mile Road between Northwestern Highway and Briarcrest Road unanimously introduced.

After Public Hearing, amending Ordinance No. 08-43 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (OS-2) planned office service district use lots 2, 3, and 4 of Farmington Hills Subdivision located on the west side of Orchard Lake Road between Ten Mile and Rocky Creek Roads unanimously introduced. After Public Hearing, amending Ordinance No. 08-44 to rezone from (RA-1) single family residential use to (OS-2) planned office service district use lot No. 1 of Farmington Hills Subdivision located on the west side of Orchard Lake Road between Ten Mile and Rocky Creek Roads unanimously introduced.

After Public Hearing, amending Ordinance No. 08-41 to rezone from (RA-3) single family residential use to (L-1) light industrial use property located between Tuck and Donkin Roads and north of Eight Mile Road (State Fabricators, Inc.) unanimously introduced. Legal advertising requirement waived and contract awarded to Albert A. Detzner and Associates, Inc. for additional storm sewer construction in the amount of \$18,400 in Fleming's Round Park Subdivision approved 5-1. Mr. Lichtenman opposed.
