### Tradition: It's alive and well

Seaholm dramatizes provide a living example of the power of tradition. Excellence in high school performances is found here and there across the country but it is not common. It is expected at Seaholm and students have made it so. Each generation of students passes on the know-how and a demand for high quality.

The community knows of the tradition of good dramatics on plays are a sell-out and spring musicals are offered two weekends. Education classes cannot provide a living example of the benefit of youth and humanity.

As crew and cast "each young student the tradition demands. Skills some teachers do not know are learned as student's struggle to achieve a quality performance.

Schools give awards to set expectations and to motivate students toward proficiency and excellence. Our culture's admiration for competition is "established" in school awards based on winning. Staff and students in our schools are encouraged to highlight a few exceptional achievers.

What's the greatest single cause for women initiating divorces? The conviction that their husband can't or won't take care of their emotional needs.

This may come as a surprise to those who have held the common misconception that divorces are the result of drinking, beating or running around. The amazing fact is that women are leaving husbands who don't drink, are responsible fathers, successful financial providers and nice guys.

All of which reinforces the idea that the foremost reason that men and women get married and stay married is to be loved and to love. The rest of it—financial security, responsible sharing of child-raising duties, and good moral behavior are important, but not nearly enough.

The complaint of these divorcing

women frequently takes the form of: "My husband thinks that all he owes me is material security and his physical presence. He cares more about his job, his hobbies, and his friends than he does about me. He only shows his dependence on me when his drawers don't have socks in them."

OFTEN, THESE love-starved women conclude that they have chosen men who are incapable of being loving, caring people. In fact, they begin to wonder whether any man have the capacity to look beyond their own selfish needs.

Inhibited by an image-consciousness that works to forbid emotionality in males, men do frequently carry handicaps to their marriages. But rarely is this a sufficient explanation for why love relationships break down.

In fact, I think that all of us, men and women together, being imperfect

tions and obstacles to the task of creating an emotionally supportive relationship.

It's not that we don't care about such things. Both sexes want very much to have a successful loving partnership in their lives.

But most people don't realize just how hard it is to do that. Most of us have believed so strongly that the key is in finding the right partner. Or we've blindly hoped that the power of romantic love would make our relationship work. So when the relationship fails you hear things like: "If you really loved me..."

Sometimes, we've gotten the idea that loving "happily ever after" is easy. On the contrary, it's a lot of work.

It requires that both partners have a working understanding of what turns love feelings on and what turns them off. It requires that both come to know each other well enough to be able to trust and trust with each other. It means that conflicts and resentments are currently worked out.

WHETHER YOU'VE found the

right person is a lot less important than whether you're both actively working to keep those loving feelings alive.

The key word here is actively.

By far, the most common mistake we make in loving partnerships is to take a passive role. We assume that if our partner loves us, she will know when we need support, she will read our minds because she will be so sensitive to our moods. And so we don't bother to state our needs. Or we are lazy about spelling out just what we want from our partner.

This is the "bushel basket" approach to asking for love. We are essentially dumping out our bushel basket of needs, with no organization, no attempt to assist our partner in his attempt to be caring. So chances of your partner failing to sort out your bushel basket accurately are actually quite slim.

ADD TO THIS obstacle the tendency of love-receivers to passively accept whatever love attempts they are given. This is the "revolving picture" and it's almost as insurmountable as the bushel basket. Too often couples conclude that the love relationship is "not working" when this must be due to each other, not more. That's almost always wrong.

The person who feels less or she is not getting enough love or she is not an active or a passive love receiver.
