Field trips scheduled are visits to Greenfield Village, the Detroit Zoo, Detroit Youth Theatre and Kensington Metro Park.

Counselors provide supervision for both fun and learning in a child's first camp experience.

Camp hours for the morning sessions are 9:30 a.m. to noon on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Wednesday is field trip day when the campers meet from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Camp hours for the afternoon sessions are 1 to 3:30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, with Wednesday, again, set aside for an all-day field trip.

SESSIONS BEGIN on June 27, July 5, July 11, July 18, July 25 and Aug. 1. Cost for a week session is \$15. Campers may enroll in one, or as many sessions as desired.

Snacks are provided each day with the exception of Wednesday, the field trip day, when campers will bring their own lunch. Beverage is provided.
