allowing three hits. Both pitchers went the distance. Farmington won, 10-0.

Farmington scored its lone run in the third inning when Andy Salinas singled in Marty Bona from third.

Their only loss came to Waterford Chief Pontiac Friday, as they were downed, 3-2.
