Congregation honors Dr. William Mercer

Dr. William Mercer, senior pastor of Nardin Park United Methodist Church, was feted by his congregation this month on the completion of his 35 years in the ministry.

The reception followed morning Worship Services in the church at 2887 Eleven Mile in Farmington, and was attended by about 500 persons.

Merrill Buehler, chairman of the church board of trustees, spoke words of appreciation to the guest of honor in behalf of the guests, some parishioners from churches Dr. Mercer had served in the past and some friends and relatives from out of town.

Dr. Mercer is a native of California.

He spent his early life in Ohio and Pennsylvania before graduating from Ohio Wesleyan University and Drew Theological Seminary.

In 1971 he received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Adrian College.

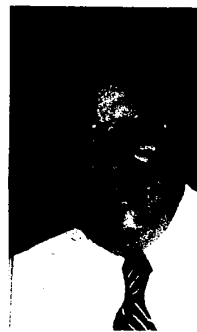
Elouise Bratton became his wife in 1943. The couple have two daughters, Marilyn Rae Hedquist and Melody Ann MacMartin.

The Larkshire beautification program involves students, parents teachers and the community in clean-ups

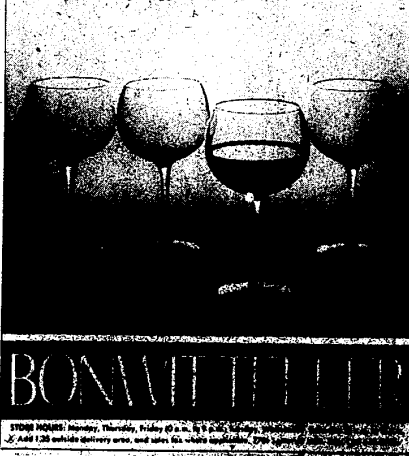
