Feminist center has new home

The Feminist Women's Health Center announces the opening of a new location at 15251 W. Eight Mile, Detroit. The only woman-controlled clinic in Michigan, the Feminist Women's Health Center is a non-profit organization dedicated to consumer control of health care and based upon the belief that women can understand about their bodies and learn to detect normal and abnormal conditions.

"Self-help Clinic" information sharing groups are sponsored monthly by the health center. In these groups, women learn how to detect normal and abnormal conditions and discuss a wide range of women's health care issues. Some topics may include birth control, estrogen replacement during menopause, and what a good gynecologist examination includes.

Special "Self-Help Clinic" presentations have been done for schools, prisons, groups of nurses and public health officials.

Services currently offered are: pregnancy screening and counseling; early termination abortion; phone counseling and referrals for health care and a speakers bureau.

The health center is planning to add a well-woman gynecological clinic soon.

Fees are based on income and Medi-

caid and private insurance are accepted. For more information, appointment or a tour of the new facility call 341-5666.

Profits from the sale are used to add to AAUW's National Educational Foundation along with funding fellowships and research.

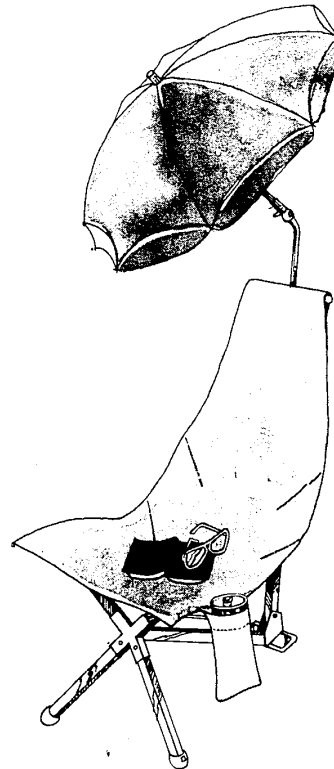

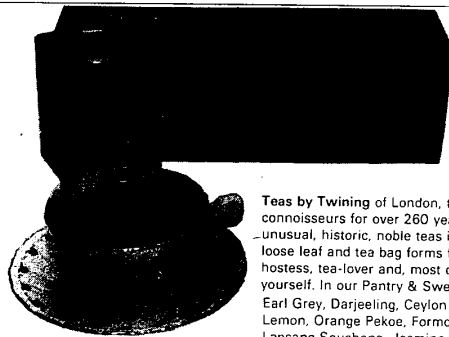

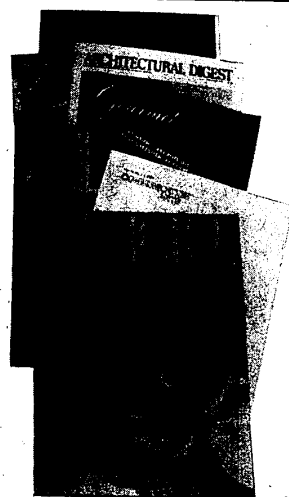


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
