The largest college football stadium in the world, Michigan Stadium, will be playing on artificial turf within the next five years," Canham said in announcing the installation of 88,285 square feet of Tartan Turf.

"The advantages of this installation are just too numerous to ignore," Canham added. He estimated that Michigan Stadium, used just six times a year for football games and other half dozen days for practice, now will be in use some 100 days during the year.

Michigan also figures to save \$15,000 annually in maintenance costs, involved in resodding and general upkeep. The entire surface in Michigan Stadium will be covered with Tartan Turf.

"We can now use our stadium for intramural, women's athletics and club sports in addition to offering it to the community and high schools," Canham explained.

HEAD COACH Bo Schembechler feels the new turf will drastically reduce knee and leg injuries.
