

Name New Methodist Ministers

Two new ministers and a new associate minister are taking over in Observerland United Methodist Churches following appointment by the church's annual Detroit Conference meeting in Adrian this week.

The Rev. Hugh C. White was named minister of the First United Methodist Church of Farmington. He succeeds Dr. W. Leslie Williams, retiring after more than 40 years in the Methodist ministry.

Authority On Youth Is Named

John Cardinal Dearden, Archbishop of Detroit, has announced the appointment of the Very Rev. Msgr. John F. Bradley, a nationally known authority on youth, as chairman of the Archdiocesan Commission on Ecumenical and Inter-religious Affairs.

He succeeds the Right Rev. Msgr. Albert A. Matyn, pastor of St. Matthew Parish, Detroit, who recently was appointed to the Archdiocesan Synodal Progress Committee which is charged with encouraging the implementation of renewal measures in Catholic life.

Msgr. Bradley will continue as pastor of Our Lady of Fatima Church, Oak Park, where he went two years ago after serving most of his ministry on university campuses. He has been national director of the Newman Apostolate, which serves students in non-Catholic colleges, archdiocesan director of the apostolate, Newman Chaplain at the University of Michigan and rector of St. Mary Chapel, Ann Arbor.

The commission he leads is

part of the department of Christian Worship, headed by the Rev. Father Patrick R. Cooney.

Part of the duty of the ecumenical commission is to encourage introduction of the principles of ecumenism into Catholic religious instruction and all phases of Catholic education. The archdiocesan policy is that not only adults, but Catholic youngsters, be given accurate information about other religions and other cultures in order to form positive ecumenical attitudes.
