Hosanna Tabor To Lay Cornerstone Sunday

The congregation of the Hosanna Tabor Lutheran Church will gather at the church's new site Sunday, June 15, for a special Cornerstone Laying Service. Special services will begin at 3 p.m. in the present church in Redford Township and the congregation will go to the building site for the laying ceremony. The present Hosanna Tabor

church is located at 9600 Leavenworth just north of West Chicago and half-way between Beech Day and Lakeland Roads.

Pastor Eugene M. Hadwiger will preach. The pastor left Hosanna Tabor just prior to Lent to assume the ministry of the Church of the Ascension in Birmingham.

The Cornerstone Laying Service is always an important milestone in a church building program.

Pastors of Hosanna Tabor, Roy G. Franschke and Bernard O. Kube will participate in the service. The church choir, under the direction of Leon Beckendorf, will sing as will the children of the Sunday School.

St. Michael Picks 1st Parish Council

Ten members were elected by the parish in a general vote June 1.

That group, meeting Wednesday, June 4, named Talbot as its leader, along with Frances J. McLaughlin, 9816 Ingram, as vice chairman and Mary E. Reeber, 9907 Melrose, as secretary.

Talbot, a purchasing agent and a member of the parish for 18 years, is father of three and director of the St. Michael Credit Union.

McLaughlin is owner and director of the Analytic and Biological Laboratories. He and his wife, Elaine, have five children. Mrs. Reeber, housewife and mother of four, has been active in many parish and school projects.

In the parish election, Talbot

was chosen for a three-year term, along with Daniel McManis, 9251 Maple, sales representative for U.S. Gypsum Co., and Robert Durivage, 10336 Blackburn, a Ford Motor Co. surveillance engineer.

Those elected for two years were Mrs. Adele Bielanczyk, 9255 Melrose, homemaker and mother of five, Robert F. Kaufman, 10306 Blackburn, junior high teacher, and Gerald T. Shaugnessy, 13300 Blackburn, senior market analyst for General Motors Corp.

McLaughlin, Mrs. Reeber, and Paul Lyons, 8937 Louisiana, Scott-Phillips Co. administrator, will serve terms of one year.

Lyons' 18-year-old daughter, Ann, was elected to a one-year term as youth member of the council. She is a senior at Ladywood-High School and planning to study nursing at Madonna College next fall.

Henry Gudith, 1040 Berwick, was appointed by the council as educational coordinator. He is an elementary school principal.

Guidelines for parish council work have been stated in a new Archdiocese publication, a 48-page book titled "The Parish Council."

It states that no set format or design will be given for the councils.

Memorial To Break Ground

A Redford Township church which is selling its nine-year-old building and property to the Jeffries Freeway project, will break ground at 25475 Five Mile Road, Livonia, on Sunday, June 15.

The ceremony will be conducted at 11:30 a.m. by the minister and members of the Memorial Church of Christ (Christian Church.) 24521

Schoolcraft. Construction of the new house of worship is expected to begin within 30 days.

The new church plant, contemporary in design, will be erected on a five-acre plot on Five Mile Road one mile west of Farmington Road. It will consist of a sanctuary that seats 488, a chapel, fellowship hall, kitchen, three assembly rooms, a choir room, 27 classrooms, and church offices.

It will contain 21,800 square feet of floor space, 19,900 of which will be at ground level. Ivan L. McElwee is the architect and Goodman Church Builders of Joplin, Missouri, will oversee the construction.

Max Copeland is minister of the Memorial church. John Packer is chairman of the building committee.



Catholics Khoren I Visiting Armenians Here

Catholics Khoren I, Holy See of Cilicia and spiritual leader of the Armenian Apostolic Church of America, will be in the Detroit area June 14 to 18.

Several Livonians have worked on arrangements for the local portion of the first visit in this country by a Catholicos of the Holy See of Cilicia.

Ara Michanian, Only Haghighian and Dr. A. Hampanian of Livonia are assisting as members of the board of trustees of St. Sarkis Armenian Apostolic Church, Dearborn.

Dr. Hampanian is serving as co-chairman of the publicity committee, along with Aram Gavor, also of Livonia.

The four-day visit, one of 12 stops in the course of the Catholicos's tour, will include two major events Sunday, June 15, a banquet in the Ford Styling Center and his celebration of the Mass in St. Sarkis Church at 10 a.m.

His mission is a dual one, to strengthen ties with Armenians throughout the North American diocese and to spearhead a fund-raising program that will implement plans for establishing a national headquarters in New York.

The Detroit community has a quota of \$50,000 in this program.
