Bliss, past president of the club, was honored for his past accomplishments and continuing support of the objects of Rotary, said Weidon Petz, retiring Rotary president.



They are: Jon Mazer, of Farmington Hills, Peter Steffes, of Farmington Hills and Eugene Morgerson, of Farmington Hills.

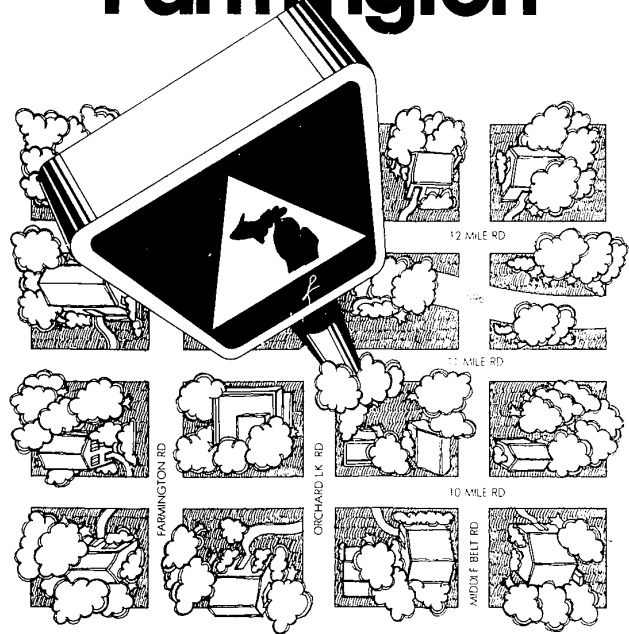
