Bennett to be ordained as deacon

Gerald L. Bennett, Farmington resident and active member of St. Andrew Episcopal Church of Livonia, will be ordained as a deacon in the Episcopal Church Saturday, July 9.

The ordination will take place at 10 a.m. in St. Andrew, 1650 Hubbard Ave. The ceremony will be the culmination of nine years of study in the Episcopal School of Theology in the Cathedral Church of St. Paul in Detroit.

Bennett, an assistant principal in the East Detroit school district, plans to continue his studies to ordination as an Episcopal priest.

He then will be eligible to serve as a non-stipendiary clergyman, probably assisting without pay in an area church, while continuing his full-time school career.

The Right Rev. William Gordon, assistant bishop of the Diocese of Michigan, will preside for the ordination as deacon.

Presenting the candidate, along with the Rev. Kenneth G. Davis, rector of St. Andrew, will be Bennett's wife, Mildred, a licensed lay reader and vestrywoman of the church.

The public is invited to attend the rites.

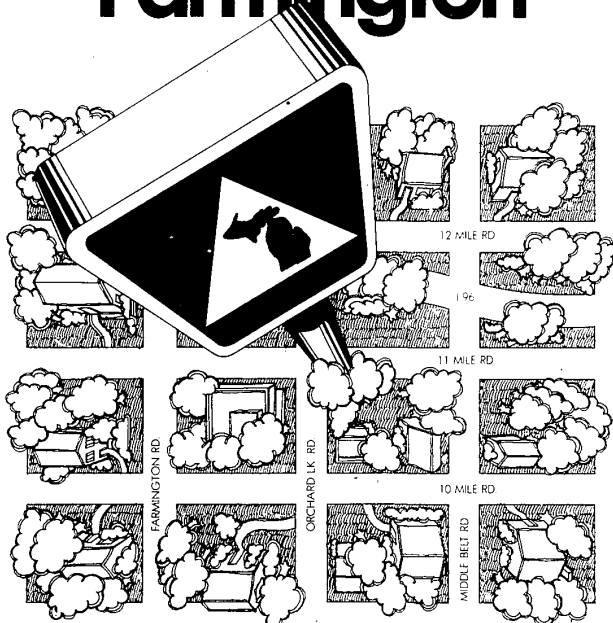
At St. Andrew, Bennett has served as vestryman, choir member, lay reader and church school teacher.

Bennett attended Albion College, Wayne State University and Eastern Michigan University and holds a BA in speech, an MA in counseling and an educational specialist degree in administration.

His wife is an elementary principal in the Farmington school district.

The Bennetts and their daughter, Catherine, a recent graduate of Farmington High School, have been Farmington residents for 14 years.
