The highway commission expects to spend about \$200,000 to landscape 8.4 miles of 1-696 (Reuther Freeway) from Halstead Road in Farmington Hills to US-24 (Telegraph Road) in Southfield. Target date for completion of the work is July 1978.

TWO KINDS of improvements will be made on the I-96 freeway just in-side the Oakland County line.

Barrier construction, pavement joint repair and resultanging are to be done on 1.2 miles just east of the Livingston County line Construction of inside and outside barriers and deck resulfacing will be done on bridges over the Huron River and the Kensington Metropark access road.


