

Burglary, assault top cops' weekend

Two suburban youths—who police say led them on a two-hour chase—will face charges in connection with a break-in at a Farmington auto supply company early Sunday morning.

James William Wylie, 19, of 3215 23 Mile, New Baltimore, and Brian Keith Wilkinson, 17, of 2119 Vance, Hazel Park, pleaded not guilty to burglary charges Monday afternoon at their arraignment before 47th District Judge Margaret Schaeffer. Bond was set at \$5,000 for each defendant.

The arrest of the alleged burglary team was the start of a busy shift for Sgt. Murray Switzer and Ptl. Pete Amato.

The two officers responded to a silent alarm at the Glendale Auto Supply Company, 2231 Orchard Lake Rd. in Farmington at about 4:45 a.m. Sunday. The two suspects used a car to force an overhead rear door of the business, setting off the silent alarm, police said.

The two suspects fled on foot when they were surprised loading their car with merchandise from the store, police said.

A tracking dog from West Bloomfield police department and Farmington Hills police officers were called to assist in capturing the pair.

Ptl. Amato discovered one of the men in the football field behind Farmington Senior High on Shawwassee; the other man was arrested on the corner of Grand River and Orchard Lake Road, about two hours after the burglary, according to police.

"He probably thought it was safe to bitchhike home then," said Public Safety Director Dan Byrnes.

Police said they recovered their dryers, typewriters and radios in the automobile used by the pair. The items are believed to be stolen from a beauty salon and construction company, police said.

SWITZER AND Amato later arrested a Detroit man in another incident, charging the him with felonious assault after he almost ran one of the officers down with his automobile, according to police.

Andrew Terrell Polk, 20, of 1891 St. Mary, pleaded not guilty to charges. Bond was set at \$500. His companion in the car, Kenneth Kendrick, 17, also

of Detroit, was charged with drunk and disorderly behavior and possession of unsealed alcohol in a vehicle. Kendrick was released without bond on the two misdemeanor charges.

About 1 a.m., Aug. 1, Switzer and Amato were called to a private home on Chestnut Street in Tall Oaks subdivision. Polk had earlier run his car over the lawn in front of his girl-

friend's house, police said.

Police were called when Polk, with Kendrick, returned to the home. The police officers blocked off each end of the street.

When one of the officers approached Polk's car, the Polk threw the car into reverse and then forward, almost running down the officer, police said. The two men were arrested without further incident, police added.

3 face drug charges

Two Farmington Hills residents and a Royal Oak woman will face a preliminary examination before 47th District Judge Margaret Schaeffer Friday in connection with charges of heroin possession.

Nancy Sue Bentley, 23 and Robert Garcia, 25, of 2886 Grayling, both of Farmington Hills, and Peggy Sue Wheeler, 24, of 2211 Starr, Royal Oak, stood mute at their July 27 arraignment before Judge Schaeffer. They are free on a bond of \$2,500 each.

They are charged with conspiring to deliver heroin and delivering heroin, according to Farmington Hills Police Capt. Russell Conway.

Police allege that the three defendants sold about four ounces of heroin to a police officer July 26.

DURING THE FARMINGTON FOUNDERS' FESTIVAL, officers arrested two persons in connection with selling PCP, an animal tranquilizer at the carnival set up on Twelve Mile near Farmington Road.

Mark Denard, 23, of 13803 Cluster, Royal Oak and Lauri Ann Rapoport, 17, of 25700 Franklin, Southfield, stood mute before Judge Schaeffer at their July 21 arraignment. Bond was set for Ms. Rapoport at \$1,000. Denard's bond was the same but was raised to \$2,000.
