Groups urge minimum wage

A campaign to urge congressional passage of a fair minimum wage law has been announced by the Labor Zionist Alliance and the A. Philip Randolph Institute.

At a conference supported by the Jewish Community Council, Jewish Labor Committee, Frontlash and Social Democrats U.S.A., Tom Turner, President of the Detroit AFL-CIO, Bishop Thomas Gumbleton and Rabbi Men From called upon Congress to set a minimum hourly wage of \$3.50, according to Norman Naimark of the Labor Zionist Alliance, is just above poverty level.

Naimark said the Carter administration's compromise proposal, set at \$2.65, is legislating poverty for those who work at a minimum wage.

Citing a government report stating a family of four needs over \$11,000 per year to live at an austere standard, Selma Goode, an organizer of the campaign, said the \$3 wage is not what is needed, but is at least a step in the right direction.

The coalition also called upon Congress to peg the minimum wage at 60 per cent of the average industrial wage, and called for agricultural workers and restaurant workers to be included under the protection of the minimum wage bill.

Ms. Goode said the coalition will embark on a lobbying campaign urging citizens to write President Carter, their congressmen and senators asking them to pass a fair minimum wage bill which will set the minimum wage no lower than \$3.

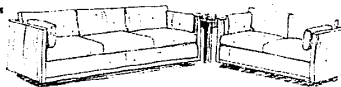
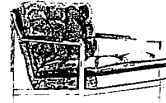
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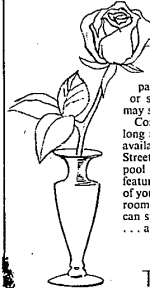
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
