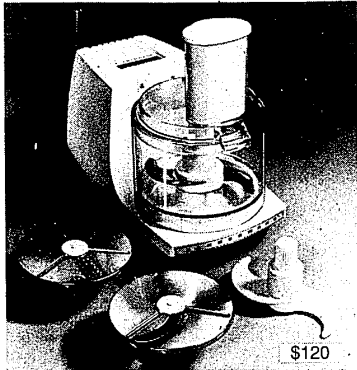

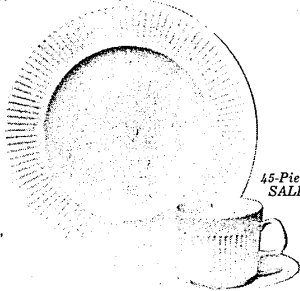

**Volunteers**

The Oakland County Volunteer Bureau, a program of the Volunteer Action Center of United Community Services, has weekly listings of agencies needing volunteers. Further information about these agencies and over 200 others that need volunteer services may be obtained from the bureau, 642-7272.

**BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP PUBLIC LIBRARY** is looking for a volunteer to serve as homebound librarian. Duties include taking books to nursing homes, visiting with patients to determine their reading interests, and keeping records of books selected. The program is operating on Wednesday afternoons from 1 to 3:30 or 4 p.m.

**PLYMOUTH CENTER FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT** in Northville needs volunteers interested in working with mentally retarded children and adults. Volunteers may play games with children, read to patients, and keep records of appointments. Someone with a chauffeur's license is also needed to drive the vans. Also needed are volunteer tutors with an education training in college to work with adults.

**UNITED FOUNDATION** in Birmingham needs volunteers to handle light typing and other general clerical duties. Hours are flexible. UF also is looking for volunteers to work in a pilot telephone campaign from Sept. 15 to Oct. 31. Callers would work one evening a week from 6 to 10 p.m. A briefing session for this program is scheduled for Sept. 6.

**HOTLINE Crisis Center** in Lathrup Village needs volunteers to serve as Hotline listeners. The position requires someone with an active concern for people who call in. The listener helps the caller to sort out his feelings and values in a non-judgmental manner. The next training program will be Aug. 21-24. Time commitment is for one three-hour period a week.

**Cancer Foundation offers aid to young**

Young adults who have cancer face many special problems—and sometimes need special help.

The Michigan Cancer Foundation's (MCF) Patient and Family Care Service offers discussion groups designed to give these young adults a chance to share their feelings and problems with others who are facing similar experiences.

"Young cancer patients are not only facing the normal turbulence associated with growing up," said JoAnn Vettesse, MCF coordinator of clinical social work for the home assistance program, "but at a time when they should be growing more independent, cancer forces them to become dependent again." "That situation creates conflict for the patient and his family, and often results in anger and frustra-

tion for everyone involved," she said. "We try to help them deal with these feelings, and realize that even though they have cancer, they are still the same people they were before diagnosis—with the same dreams and the same right to make as many of those dreams come true as possible."

These on-going groups for young cancer patients meet once each month at Michigan Cancer Foundation headquarters, 110 E. Warren, Detroit. To register for the groups, or for more information, call the MCF patient and family care service at 833-0710, ext. 301, weekdays.

The Michigan Cancer Foundation, a Torch Drive-United Way agency, offers programs in cancer research, screening and detection, and patient and family care and rehabilitation.

**New collection displays heritage**

A new line on an old theme was introduced at the Southern Furniture Market by the MaLeck Woodcraft, Wingate, N.C. It's called the "Country Collection," and coincides with the nation's current interest in heritage.

It's perfect for the current trend towards country kitchen, family room decor. A touch of the authentic 18th century American home look can be added by means of furniture pieces and accessories.

The furniture is also functional as well as decorative. For the entry hall, a real eye-catcher and functional piece is a floor-based coat rack and umbrella holder. The rack portion is carved in a star pattern with a center square mirror.

For the entry or hall or just over a table, is a colonial mirror. In colonial days, mirrors were rare and costly, so they demanded the best frames as protection. In replica scrolls and curves done in pine, it makes an unusual focal point. It comes in warm antique pine.

There's a Shaker light stand and colonial fire-screen. The ratchet candle stand is perfect for accessories such as plants, bowls of flowers, or a small collection. The simple design reflects Shaker tradition. The fire-screen holds in-process needlework, creweling, embroidery or paintings and comes in warm antique pine finish. The stand is 60 inches high and the sliding frame 18 by 14 inches.

A different touch for the family room or a child's playroom is the space-saving half-round stool. It captures functional early American design. Fitting neatly against a wall, it is ideal for planters. The colonials used the originals to step up to high beds.

Part of the collection is a colonial trestle stand, a graceful 18th century reproduction for use anywhere because its design mixes well with modern, contemporary and traditional.

Not often seen but a decorative, functional, charming piece, is the early American quilt rack. For accessories in the authentic vein are two colonial-style candle holders, one a two-candle holder with adjustable candle arm and the other a pair done in a simple wood-turning.

There are many more pieces in this country collection. In achieving the right mood for a room, the accessories are very important.

In a country style room, warm colors, floral prints and wood create the effect of the English countryside.

**State polls set meet**

Presidential Energy Assistant Dr. James Schlesinger, ecologist Barry Commoner and Atlantic Richfield President Thornton Bradshaw will discuss American energy policies at the annual meeting of the national conference of state legislatures (NCSL) in Detroit, Aug. 2-5. The meeting will be held at the Plaza Hotel, in the Renaissance Center.

Other major speakers scheduled to address 1,500 state legislators and legislative staff are former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, Secretary of Commerce Juanita Kreps and ABC news correspondent Herb Kaplan.

Detroit Mayor Coleman Young and Gov. William Milliken will deliver welcoming remarks to the delegates at the opening session.

Workshops and seminars at the four-day meeting will deal with state taxing policies, hospital cost containment, energy initiatives, sunset legislation, voter registration, welfare reform, budgetary innovations and decriminalization of marijuana.

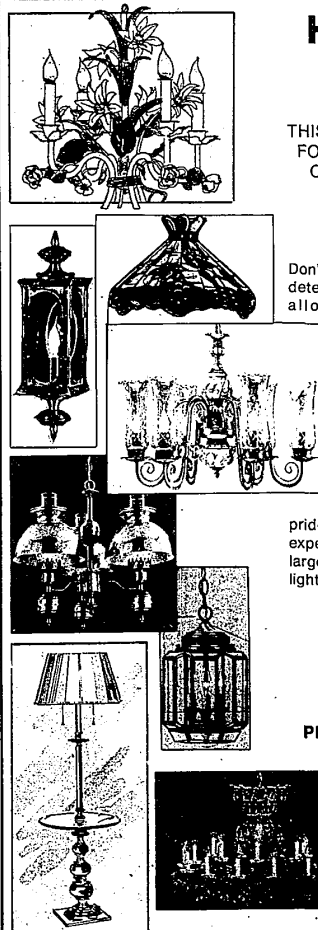
