Event offers art, concert

Concerts

A cultural afternoon, featuring the works of a fast-rising American artist and a family concert by Detroit's Max Davey Singers, is scheduled to begin at 3 p.m. Aug. 14 in the Farmington Community Center on Farmington Road between Ten and Eleven Mile roads.

The art exhibit by artist Bob Harper of Richmond, Va., will be held in the center's Community House. The Max Davey concert of music for everyone will take place under the towering trees of the center's outdoor amphitheater.

Harper, who has been commissioned on several occasions to demonstrate his paintings before units of the U.S. Armed Forces, works mostly in black and white, which he feels "can reveal my message with more impact and clarity."

Striving for universality, Harper says his intention is to "paint pictures that people anywhere in the world can identify with regardless of their academic or cultural background."

HIS FIRST one-man show abroad was on a battlefield in 1969 for the troops in South Vietnam. He has exhibited his paintings in many major American cities and has exhibited in Europe, the Middle East, Africa, Central and South America, the Caribbean and the Far East. In the winter of 1970, Harper received a commission from the U.S. Defense Department to prepare a series of paintings for the permanent gallery of the Pentagon in Washington, D.C.

One of Harper's main goals is to promote an awareness of the arts, and Concert Series Inc. has scheduled the combination of graphic art and music to achieve that purpose.

The Max Davey Singers, accompanied by Detroit area musicians and a small contingent of dancers, performs twice-a-year shows featuring headline entertainers such as pianist Roger Williams, Metropolitan Opera star Jerome Hines, mimic Shari Lewis and comedian Steve Allen.

Mikado opens at Detroit Plaza

Mikado, an authentic Japanese restaurant, is the newest addition to the eateries at the Detroit Plaza Hotel. Located on the riverside of the Renaissance Center, Mikado combines Japanese cuisine and decor with Western-style comfort.

There are three dining rooms, each with its own distinctive decor and service. The traditional Japanese tatami rooms feature raised seating areas where guests dine at floor-level tables.

Another room holds more modern steak tables, at which food is prepared in front of the guest. The third room contains standard Western-style seating.

Tableside hibachi-style cooking is available in both the standard and tatami rooms. In addition, there's a separate cocktail lounge with a bar.

In the JAPANESE tradition, guests are asked to take off their shoes before entering the tatami room and place them in a special storage slot. They enter the room in stocking feet and sit on a special two-inch thick tatami rug. Each dining room is secluded by an opaque shoji screen, which makes the tatami rooms Detroit's most private dining experience.

Some of the tatami rooms feature a tokonoma, a recessed area within the wall containing a simple fresh flower arrangement.

The steak tables are a recent innovation in Japanese cooking. Up to seven guests can sit around a steak table, which contains a large burner at its center. The steaks and fresh Oriental ingredients are brought to the table where a kimono-clad server prepares the food to the guest's preference. Preparation of the meal is entertaining in itself.

Alternating shades of bronze and gold-flecked wallpaper and a bright woven carpet provide a colorful environment in which to experiment and dine.

The standard Western-style room is the first guests see as they enter Mikado off Renaissance Drive South. This room also contains all the traditional Japanese elements—bamboo chairs and dividers, tree trunks supporting beams, Kawara (wavy tiles) hanging low over the eaves and the shoji screens—yet offers the comfort of tables and chairs. Western International Hotels imported many of the decor items from Japan.
