

From soccer to swimming

Farmington Hills Parks and Rec welcomes new season

Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department has more fall classes in line. Anyone who lives in the Farmington School District is eligible for the program.

Persons can register by mail or at Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Office on Eleven Mile near Orchard Lake.

Classes will be canceled due to insufficient registration or other occurrence beyond the department's control. Refunds will be given out until the second class session. A \$2 administrative fee will be withheld unless the class is canceled.

*Kayaking will be introduced to beginners Sept. 6, 12, 20, 26. The outing will be Oct. 1. Classes will be held at Farmington High School's pool 7-10 p.m. Field experience will be in Delhi Metropark near Ann Arbor. Fee is \$39.

*Orienteering will teach the reading of topographical maps, navigation

technique and practice games. There will be four class meetings and a one-day outing. Minimum age is 12 years old. Sessions are Oct. 5, 12, 19, 26 from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. in Farmington City Hall. The outing will be Oct. 29. There is a \$29 fee, which includes compass.

*Outdoor Photography will cover the basic use of adjustable cameras with emphasis on shooting outdoors. The fall session will be Oct. 4, 11, 18, 25 from 7 p.m.-10 p.m. at Farmington Hills City Hall. There is a \$29 fee.

*Historical Bicycle Tour will take participants into Marshall, Mich., Oct. 15-16. The trip will include a 50-mile bike trip from Lansing to Marshall, one night's lodging at a local inn, brunch at Win Schuler's, a cocktail hour, lunch tour of 19th century homes and historical monuments such as the Governor's Mansion, Capital Hill School and Honolulu House. Return transportation by car for

riders and bikes is included. There is a limit of 15 persons. Fee is \$69.

*Pictured Rocks Adventure will give a glimpse into the life of the Michigan pioneer and trapper. The five-day wilderness expedition into the Pictured Rocks National Shoreline on Lake Superior will cost \$176.25. A \$50 deposit is required. The trip will combine camping, snowshoeing, cross country skiing and wilderness exploration. The tour will leave the Detroit area Dec. 20 and return Dec. 26. It will include a stop at Tahquamenon Falls. The fee includes transportation, food and some equipment as well as the services of two experienced instructors. Cross-country skiing equipment rental is extra.

*SAFETY CLINIC will include Duck Identification. The Michigan Duck Hunter's Association will conduct a three-session clinic which includes duck identification, bone struc-

ture, point value of ducks and habitat. The clinic will be at Farmington Hills City Hall, Sept. 7, 14, 21. Classes will be 7:30-10 p.m. Fee is \$2. Registration is at the first meeting.

*Hunter's Safety will be conducted on Wednesdays, Oct. 5 and 12. The fee is \$3. Attendance at both sessions is required to complete the course. Youth between 12 and 17 must participate in a hunter's safety class to get a hunting license, according to state law.

*Snowmobile Safety is offered for youngsters from 12-16 years old. This clinic will cover nomenclature, first aid, general safety, state laws and regulations and maintenance. It is offered in cooperation with the Department of Natural Resources. Classes will be 7-10 p.m. Nov. 2 and 9 at Farmington Hills City Hall. Fee is \$3. Attendance at both sessions is required to complete the course and obtain the certificate.

*Boating Safety will begin April 1978 for youths 12-16.

*CPR—Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation courses will be Sept. 15, 22 and 29 in Farmington City Council Chambers, city hall. Classes will be 7-10 p.m. There is a \$3 fee. Classes are free for adults over 60 years old. Registration deadline is Sept. 15.

*First Aid classes will be 7-10 p.m. on Oct. 6, 13, 20, 27; Nov. 3, 10, 17 in Farmington Hills City Council Chambers, city hall. Registration deadline is Oct. 6. Fee is \$2. Adults over 60 years old are admitted free.

*Golf Tournament will be at San Marino Golf Course. This is the first such championship. Men will play 45 holes on Sept. 9, 10, 11 for \$19, which includes greens fee. Women will play 27 holes Sept. 16, 17 and 18. Women's fee is \$14. There is a Sept. 3 deadline on registration. Golfers must be 13 years old as of Aug. 1, 1977.

There will be awards in all flights. Handicaps will be used for placement into flights.

*Turkey Trot will be on Nov. 19 at San Marino Golf Club. Runners may participate in age divisions beginning with youth, 10 and under through 60+, over 60. The trot begins at 10 a.m. Registration will be on the site before the races. There is a \$1 fee. Certificates, medals and turkeys will be awarded.

*Chess Club will meet at the Farmington Branch Library, 2350 Liberty. Meetings will be 7-9:45 p.m., Sept. 19, May 22. All equipment will be supplied by players.

*Boys and Girls Basketball will be formed into two leagues—fifth and sixth grade boys and girls and seventh and eighth grade boys and girls. Three clinics will be conducted during December for all participants and

Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department is unveiling its fall classes. All residents of Farmington and Farmington Hills and the outlying areas within the Farmington School District are eligible for the programs.

Persons can register by mail or at Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Office on Orchard Lake and Eleven Mile in the civic center by using the registration form.

Sign up for swimming lessons at the location where you plan to attend. Registrations are on a first-come, first-serve basis. Non-residents will be assessed a \$1 additional fee for each class.

Classes will be cancelled due to insufficient registration or other occurrence beyond the department's control.

Refunds will be given out until the second class session. A \$2 administrative fee will be withheld unless the Parks and Recreation Department cancels the class.

*Boys and Girls Soccer will begin their games on Oct. 1. The program is open to boys and girls in kindergarten to first grades and in the second and third grades. Games will be played on Saturdays and teams will practice once a week. Registration ends on

Sept. 19. There is a \$6 participation fee. A volunteer coaches' clinic and meeting will be at 9 a.m., Sept. 24. Register at the Parks and Recreation Office, 31555 Eleven Mile Road.

*After School Recreation will be conducted on Monday through Thursday from 3:30-5:30 p.m. Sites for the activities include Fairview, Planders, Gill, Kenbrook and Shawassaw schools. Children will be able to study exploratory art, ballet, guitar, creative art, gymnastics, karate and jazz dance. Modeling, photography, preschool, drawing and painting and drama classes will be offered.

Teens and adults can participate in volleyball, disco dance, guitar, slim-nastics, knitting and crocheting, iaz-nastics, yoga, belly dance, gymnastics, woodcarving, tap dance and needlepoint. Photography, square dance and art are included.

*Special Recreation Programs will be offered for the handicapped and the mildly-to-moderately-ambulatory from 6-16 years old. The fall session will be from Oct. 1 to Nov. 19. There is an \$8 charge. Arts and crafts, gym activity and swim activity will be offered. Check the recreation department for times and location.

*Swimming lesson for beginners and advanced swimmers will be offered at Farmington High School and North Farmington High School. Register at the school you will attend.

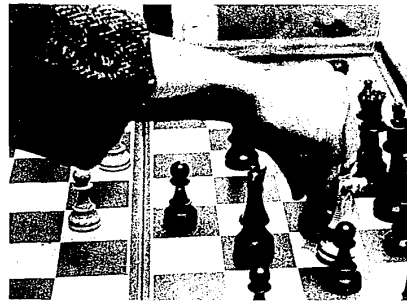
The fall session registration is between 9 a.m.-noon, Sept. 17. Lessons begin Oct. 1 to Nov. 19. There are ten levels of classes based on ability. Fee for each eight day session is \$10. Suits and towels will be furnished by participants. Anyone with long hair is required to wear a bathing cap. If a child's chin height is less than 38 inches, parents must accompany him for open swimming. To participate in lessons, the youngsters must be at least 38 inches high at the chin. Swim

suits are required, cut outs are not allowed.

*Adult Beginners Swim Lessons will be at Farmington High School and North Farmington High. The fall sessions will be held 8:15-9:15 p.m., Oct. 5 to Nov. 9. Registration is from 9 a.m. to noon, Sept. 17. Adults 18 years old and over are eligible. There is a \$10 fee.

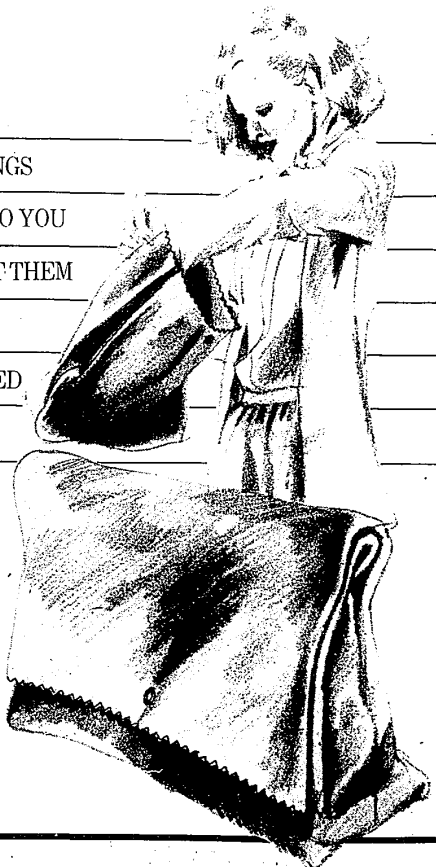
*Recreation Open Swim will start its fall sessions Sept. 12 and end Dec.
