

Bridge

The bid of double of one in a suit is a request to partner to bid an unbid suit. The most common take-out double occurs when it immediately follows an opening bid of one in a suit. It says in effect, "partner, my hand will make a good dummy."

The hand in the diagram contributed to a section top for Ruth Potulsky of Utica and Bonnie Ward of Troy in the Women's Pair event at the Detroit Summer Sectional at the Plymouth Hilton last weekend.

Ruth made a very strategic bid of one heart after Bonnie's diamond opening was doubled. East doubled the heart bid (showing hearts). When South rebid diamonds, Ruth raised. East was reluctant to compete at the three level.
