FARC Summer Fun Tomorrow

The Farmington Area Recreation Commission's six-week summer program will begin June 23. Registration forms will be available on opening day and throughout the entire program. The forms can be picked up at any of the eight school sites being used.

The north section includes Eagle School, Bood, Wooddale, and 10 Mile. Shawansee, William Grace, Cloverdale and Gill School make up the south section. The program is free of charge except for field trips to the Zoo and Bob-Lo Island.

In order to participate, youngsters must be eight years of age and may not exceed 15 years of age. Children are required to register on opening day. If possible, at the school nearest their home after 8:30 a.m.

The schedule calls for the north section to swim on Mondays and Wednesdays and the south section to swim on Tuesdays and Thursdays, excluding the holiday day when there will be no recreational activities. Alternate days will be spent at the playgrounds in the pursuit of sports and craft activities.

The north section will visit the Zoo on June 27 and attend a Tiger baseball game on Saturday, July 12. The south section will visit Tiger Stadium on Saturday, July 5 and see the girls at the zoo on July 18.

A field day for all school sites is planned for July 25.

to coincide with the Founders Festival. Children will compete in contests for prizes donated by merchants of the area. A combined trip to Bob-Lo Island is planned for both groups on Aug. 1.

On swimming days the buses will board from 8:15-8:45 a.m. and will leave at 8:45 a.m. sharp. Children must bring their own lunch and a canvas bag for their clothes. Buses will return at 3 p.m.

There will be playground activities from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. on opposite days from swimming.

The zoo trip will cost 30 cents for the train ride and the "chimpanzee" show. The baseball game is free. The cost of the Bob-Lo boat ride is 80 cents for youngsters 12 years old and younger, and \$1.75 for those older. This does not include the cost of entertainment on the island.

Questions relative to safety precautions at the beach and bus departure times are answered on registration forms. Questions not answered can be directed to the FARC office after June 24 between the hours of 9:15-9:45 a.m. as shown on the registration form.

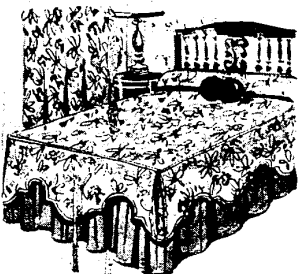

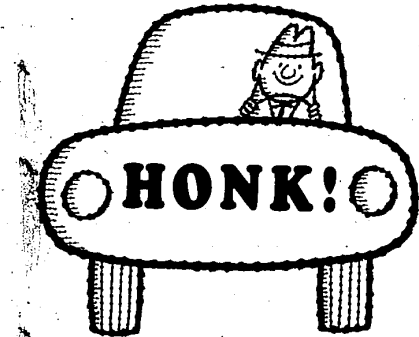
