

Libraries have instant programs

Program chairmen often need ideas for quality programs and, regrettably, there is need for a quick fill-in for program cancellations, too.

The Baldwin and Bloomfield Township public libraries are able to offer at least 23 good suggestions.

The community libraries are the only ones in Oakland County designating Films Library, James M. Moore, who represents the Canadian Travel Film Library, said "The films are designed for adult audiences."

There is no charge to use the films, which range in length from 10 minutes to half an hour. Subjects include tours of entire provinces such as Ontario, or visits to specific places, such as the Ontario Science Center.

Once every three months the duplicate bridge clubs, sanctioned by the American Contract Bridge League, are entitled to hold a club championship.

The master point reward is greater than the regular weekly duplicate game. Some clubs present trophies or additional prize money to the winners as an added incentive.

The hand in the diagram was their favorite. The contract was defeated on occasion with a spade lead. Declarer losing the diamond queen to West's king in addition to a spade and a spade ruff.

Even with a spade lead, the contract is secure. Declarer must refuse the diamond finesse; play the ace and the jack to West's king. West can cash the

high spade, but East does not have a diamond to trump the third spade. George, as declarer, was lucky. He even performed miracles. He took twelve tricks when the defense led a

heart, losing only the diamond king.
